## CRICKET NOTES.

Arthur Zealley has been piling on a tremendous lot of runs, having made 180 in three innings, and now it will be a very interesting matter as to whether he, or Harrison, gets the average bat.

Bridport's successes this year are certainly due to those two cricketers, but the Bridport fielding has been better than we have seen it for some years.

R. Stembidge was very unlucky to be run out against Beaminster, when no doubt he would have got many more runs. He secured two very nice catches in the slips and is quite one of Bridport's best men.

Captain Udal has been very useful as a bowler but is rather too fast for our second-class wickets and at times is positively dangerous.

We are glad to see Dr. MacCarthy doing so well with the bat. He is a most popular sportsman and cricketer in Bridport owes much to the enthusiastic way he supports the Bridport captain. His score of 78 last Thursday included 11 fours, some of which were beautiful drives. "Good old Doctor! We hope you'll get a lot more runs."

J. Zealley is a better cricketer this year than during the last five seasons. He is not only making many more runs but also proves himself a reliable change-bowler.

A Swaffield batted really well against Weymouth College, and had 16 to his credit when the innings was declared closed. We hope to see him make a good score before the season is over.

S. Stembidge is unlucky in not getting runs, but we hope to see his luck turn soon.

## CRICKET.

**BRIDPORT v. WERMOUTH COLLEGE.**—Bridport journeyed to Weymouth last Thursday to play the College. The boys were anxiously looking forward to the match and hoping to win, as they had not lost a match since Bridport defeated them some six weeks ago. They are a greatly improved eleven, and have lately been coached by Stacey, the Dorset professional. Winning the toss Bridport went first to the wicket. The commencement was disastrous. J. Zealley was snapped at the wicket for one, J. Gittins failed to score, and the Bridport captain was also caught behind the wicket with the score at 12, three wickets being thus down for 12. A. Zealley and Dr. MacCarthy were now partners, and a very different aspect was then put on the game, the two not being parted until the telegraph notched 166 for four. Too much praise cannot be given to these two batsmen, who really played excellent cricket, Dr. MacCarthy getting 78, and A. Zealley 73. A. Swaffield got 18, not out, and then the Bridport captain declared the innings closed with 203 for nine. **Going in to bat the boys did all they could to avoid defeat, five of them reaching double figures, which, however, was no good, the last wicket falling just before half-past six for 114 runs. ## CRICKET.

**BEATON I.S.D. v. SHERBORNE.**—At Beaton on Wednesday, and resulted in a win for Sherborne by 183.

**GAUNTS v. WIMBORNE.**—At Gaunts on Wednesday, a tie resulting on the first innings. The visitors batted first and scored 47, and the homesters were dismissed for a similar score.

**SHERBORNE SCHOOL PAST AND PRESENT v. DORSET RANGERS.**

—Played on the school ground at Sherborne on Wednesday, and ended in a win for the School Past and Present by an innings and 63 runs. Dorset Rangers were all got out for 71, and then Sherborne made 206. The Rangers' second innings only yielded 72.

**TEST MATCH.**—The fourth Test Match ended at Manchester, on Wednesday, in a draw. The Australians, after raising their second innings total to 270 for nine wickets, declared the closure, leaving England with 808 to get to win, and two and a-half hours for play. During that time they obtained 108 runs at the cost of three wickets.

**FIRST-CLASS CRICKET.**—There was some exciting cricket at Portsmouth, on Wednesday, but the game ended in a draw. Gloucestershire declared at five o'clock, but O. B. Fry and Mead batted so well that Hants only failed to win by 12 runs. Surrey defeated Somerset by an innings and 80 runs. Middlesex drew their match with Sussex, but they had only one wicket left. Northants defeated Derbyshire by an innings and 93 runs. The Leicestershire and Essex match was drawn. In an exciting flush Worcestershire defeated Gloucestershire at Worcester, on Saturday, by one wicket. All other Saturday's matches were drawn. On Tuesday Somerset defeated Gloucestershire by 116 runs, Northants beat Leicestershire by an innings and 111 runs, and Kent gained a victory over Middlesex by an innings and 37 runs.

**BRIDPORT v. BATH WANDERERS.**—This two days match has now quite become an annual fixture and is looked forward to with no small amount of interest. Played at Bridport on Monday and Tuesday, victory again rested with the home team, after the latter had been 43 runs behind when each side had completed an innings. In Bath Wanderers' first innings Arthur Zealley and Billy Watts divided the spoils, each securing five, the former taking his for 50 and the latter his for 50 runs. In the visitors' second innings Zealley secured six wickets for 49 and Watts four for 25. For the visitors Stewart was the most effective trundler. Getting only 79 runs in their second venture the visitors left the home team 122 runs to get to secure victory, and this was done for the loss of seven wickets. Bridport thus winning a keenly contested and highly interesting match by three wickets. H. Stambidge played good cricket in his second innings and is a greatly improved bat, whilst his fielding was excellent. It seems somewhat curious that the "veteran" trundlers of the home team (Zalley and Watts) are still the only dependable bowlers, and that "old age" has not impaired their prowess was amply demonstrated in this match. IS CRICKET DYING OUT?

To the Editor. SIR,—Perhaps you may find space in your columns for a few words from an old cricketer, who has played and loved cricket well over forty years, and still hopes to make a few more notches ere falling eight and powers have their way, and the bat is laid aside for good. Not the first time my pen has been taken up with the idea of putting in a word for the old game, but hitherto I have spared the public what some would call the haverings of an old fogey.

Now, however, so many letters have recently appeared in various papers as the result of this season's lamentable Test matches, I, too, feel I must have my say. Many suggestions have been made, but I think they all miss the mark. It seems to me that the whole thing lies in a nutshell. Cricket in England, if not actually dying out, is at any rate losing popularity, and what are the causes? First, money; and secondly, the length of matches. As regards the first. In my young days county matches were played by amateurs, and the professional element did not then predominate as it now does. The Gentlemen v. Players match was a fight between batting on one side, and bowling on the other. The Gentlemen couldn't bowl, and the Players couldn't bat. Now the professionals do both, and amateurs, with a few exceptions, cannot compete with the professionals with the result that county cricket is relegated to the latter. Well, the professionals have to be paid, and those counties that have big towns, and consequently big "gates," have it all their own way. Promising young players, in counties such as Dorset, are bought up by the longer purses, and such counties have no chance, being, moreover deserted by the amateurs, who not caring to play endless losing games, prefer to qualify for other counties, where money is more plentiful. Again, if money is a necessity, present day cricket defeats this end. People won't go and see long drawn out matches, beginning at eleven or twelve in the morning, lasting three days, and then probably unfinished. "Gates" at football show a very different tune, and the reason is obvious.

In old days each ground had its one or more professional for practice bowling and tending the ground. In friendly matches should there be a dearth of bowlers, the professional was included in the side by arrangement. Nowadays, sides, especially county teams, are composed of professionals, with the addition of an occasional amateur, and the result is, and must be, that amateurs, unless in the first flight, get no cricket, and so don't play at all. Cricket then was a pleasure, and what fun it was! Now it's a business, dependent on the beastly rupee (forgive me, I'm an old Indian). Then you knew personally all your own side at any rate. But of late years I found myself playing, a stranger amongst strangers, and cricket under those circumstances loses half its charm.

I see Mr. A. G. Steele, in a letter to the Daily Mail of the 7th inst., begged for young players, and not the "old brigade," for the next Test match; but did not he miss the point? I take it the old players are played because they are the best, and why? Because there are no youngsters to pick from. So few young men play cricket at all, for the reason, and I sympathise with them, that as cricket is played now, it is no fun, only business.

It seems to me that the remedy consists in two things; Let county amateur cricket be inaugurated, and secondly reduce the time allowed for matches—county matches being allowed two days, and all other matches, one—this can be done, by beginning at 10 a.m. instead of 12, and by narrowing the bat by one inch—the effect of the latter would be, smaller scores and harder hitting—what was taken off the edge of the bat would go on to its thickness, and vastly increase its driving power.

Lastly: I venture to say that with brighter strokes and four innings complete in a day, "gates" would increase and more matches could be played.—Yours truly, BROOMSTICK.
