On Friday the wicket was in much better condition and Surrey took their score to 306, thereby gaining a lead of 160. Davis, making many fine drives and leg-hits, scored 112 in 115 minutes; his chief strokes were twenty-two 4's. Smith helped him to put on 68 in 55 minutes, Lees 59 in 35, and Strudwick, who hit Warren for four 4's, 44 in a quarter of an hour. Derbyshire gave a miserable display when they went in the second time. 


