Going in again, Essex also found difficulty in run-getting, the fourth wicket falling at 83. Perrin, however, played a sound game, and Russell (A. C.) and Freeman made useful scores. BEDFORDSHIRE v. SUFFOLK.

At Bedford, on Wednesday, in cheerless weather, the visitors made one change from the advertised team. Waters, the Ipswich pro., playing in place of R. L. Wilson. Although without their fast bowler, Morocco, Beds. were strengthened by the inclusion of Wharmby, whose damaged finger had healed sufficiently for him to play. The homesters won the toss, batted first, and with only a single recorded King was bowled by Cobbold. The other bowler was Trudgett, who ought to have been credited with a wicket in the first over. Quaife failing to take an easy catch, which would have disposed of Holdstock, who in this match last year made a century. Both the last-named and Wharmby had luck in the slips. Wharmby made some hard shots, and in attempting to run for a hit to third man, he ran Holdstock out at 19. Willett was run out at 32 in trying a third run for Wharmby. Trudgett throwing down the wicket from 50 yards range. Five later Waters relieved Trudgett, and without addition Wharmby, who had knocked up 29, was a victim to Cobbold, who had bowled eight maidens in 13 overs. Orr was missed by C. W. Alexander off Cobbold in the long field, and then Keenan, who had been in over half an hour without scoring, opened his account with a hook shot for 3. With the latter easily caught at mid-on, half the side were out for 46. Trudgett, Alexander, and Wilson all tried to effect a separation before lunch, but failed.

On resuming, Wilson and Trudgett bowled. Orr soon completed his 50. Penfold's absence was being severely felt, for no one but Cobbold looked like getting wickets, and runs came at a great pace. Eighty were put on in 45 minutes, and the score had been advanced to 183 before Apthorpe sent a full toss to Waters in the long field, and was held. The wicket had put on 137 at a time when things were looking serious for Bedfordshire, Apthorpe's 47 was without a chance. Orr was then hearing his century, so that his let off early in his innings proved most serious. Since then he had given nothing like a chance, and when he reached the coveted three figures was the recipient of general applause.

Foy shaped well until he gave Trudgett his first wicket at 215. Clark did not make a long stay, but Orr continued to score merrily, being missed off Waters when 135; three later Trudgett bowled him. Amongst his hits were thirteen 4's and two 3's. Without addition, the last wicket fell, the total being 254.

G. H. Walters and S. Hill-Wood opened for Suffolk, and commenced run-getting quickly, but the latter was bowled after a quarter of an hour's batting, whilst Alexander failed to score. The batsmen were handicapped at the top end by the sun in their eyes, and Quaife while batting there was struck by a fast ball from Grierson, and had to retire. The latter was relieved by Clark at 44. Captain Wilson and C. W. Alexander exercised care, and at 53 Foy trundled instead of Wharmby, and bowled Wilson in his second over. Wharmby was soon on again, and after Murray had despatched him to the boundary, he got him caught at the wicket. This was at 75. Quaife returned, only to lose Alexander two later. Cobbold rattled up runs quickly, without being unduly reckless, and sent up the century. He was soon top scorer. Quaife kept up his end, and at the close Suffolk required 41 to save the follow-on.

BEDFORDSHIRE v. SUFFOLK.

This game was resumed at Bedford on Thursday in dull light. Quaife and Cobbold soon got busy in attempting to save the follow-on, and Orr, a leg-break bowler, was hit for 21 in two overs, Cobbold making superb shots, the Harrow drive predominating. Having passed his 60 with a grand boundary, he was bowled. He was mainly responsible for carrying the score from 77 to 151. With Bennett in, the follow-on was saved. Quaife played in quite his old style, although scoring slowly. The end of the innings appeared in sight when Bennett left at 186. Trudgett, however, was no easy victim, and the second century was entered upon. Quaife reached his 50 just before Trudgett was bowled. He carried out his bat for a meritorious 55, the last four wickets having put on no fewer than 140. Bedfordshire started with a lead of 37. Cobbold bowled Holdstock with his second ball, and King was dismissed before lunch.

Only eight were added after lunch before Trudgett beat Wharmby, whilst at 52 Cobbold sent Keenan back. Orr hit as vigorously as on the previous day, whilst Willett played patiently, the hitting in Captain Wilson relieving Trudgett at 80. Orr rather appreciated the change, judging by the way he made runs, and the century quickly appeared. When within one of 50, Orr was smartly taken at square leg, and half the side were out for 121. Apthorpe and Willett scored space with the result that the homesters were placed in a safe position. Willett reached 50 amid applause, and at 181 Apthorpe was bowled in attempting to secure a few more runs before declaring. Wicket fell fast after this, the last four only making 21. The innings closed for 203, to bat, so they had a draw to play for.

A wicket fell early, and others followed, but the visitors effected the draw.

BEDFORD v. SUFFOLK.

Following up their victory over Herts. at Watford on Tuesday, Suffolk appeared at the Modern School ground on Wednesday morning. The ground was in grand condition, with a drying and improving wicket. The home captain won the toss and chose to bat first. With a northerly wind and no sun before lunch it was more in keeping with overcoats than flannels. Later the sun gave out a welcome warmth, and coaxed out quite a social assemblage.

BEDFORDSHIRE'S BAD BEGINNING.

Bedfordshire started disastrously. With only one run scored King, who began the innings with Holdstock, was bowled in the first over, in playing forward to a ball which broke in a lot from the off. With Cobbold getting tremendous work on the ball, and the fielding close, runs came very slowly. Cobbold sent down six overs for two runs. The batsmen seemed settling down when a brilliant stop and return by Walters caused further misfortune for Beds., Holdstock being run out. The score was now at 19 for two. With Willett and Wharmby together the pace of run getting improved, and the spectators were looking for some bright cricket, when Willett was thrown out by a magnificent return from the long field in attempting a third run for a drive by Wharmby. Three for 31 was not promising. Walters for Trudgett was the first change at 37. In the next over Wharmby was bowled by a ball from Cobbold, which broke from the leg and took his off stump. This brought the skipper and Keenan together. Even Mr. Orr paid court to the fine bowling and suppressed his bent, content to abide his time. At forty, which total had taken over an hour to collect, he was badly missed in the long field off Cobbold. He had then made 2. At 46 Keenan put an easy catch into Alexander's hand at mid-on, and half the wickets were down.

ORR AND APTHORP HIT OUT.

With a favourite drive to the on boundary Orr sent up the 50 after nearly 90 minutes' play. The next 10 occupied just two minutes, and all went down to Orr's account. Apthorp soon caught the hitting infection, but was not so good at getting the ball away. Trudgett had a second turn with the ball, but proving expensive, he was displaced by Alexander, off whom Orr kept up his pace. This 30 runs occupied just 15 minutes in the making. Having bowled 21 overs for 28 runs Cobbold took himself off for Wilson, another slow leg breaker. Ere long Cobbold resumed at the other end. Just before lunch Orr sent up the first century with a leg boundary off Wilson, the lunch-time score being 103, Orr 44 and Apthorp 16. In a bright half hour's cricket these two had put on 53 runs in contrast with the first 50, which took just three times as long.

Orr quickly completed his 50 after lunch. Then he placed Trudgett twice to the leg boundary, and pushing along had at 140 made 72 to Apthorp's 27. The first fifty after lunch were added in 22 minutes, the pair having put on over 100 in less than an hour's batting. 80 had been added after the interval in 45 minutes, when Apthorp fell to a brilliant catch in the country. The stand had carried the total from 46 to 183 in 70 minutes, and had rescued the home county from the slough of despond into which they were fast sinking.

With Foy as his partner Orr completed his century amid general cheers, and soon after, the 200 appeared. Foy left at 215 for a stylish 11, and Clark at 236. Wever was soon off the mark, but during his tenure of the crease Orr's valuable innings was closed by Trudgett at 254, at which total the innings came to an end by Grierson being taken by Alexander at mid-off.

SUFFOLK'S REPLY.

At 4.30 Suffolk opened their venture with Walker and Wood, Wharmby and Grierson bowling. Runs came at a fair pace until at 29 Wharmby found his way to Walker's stumps. Seven runs later a brilliant catch by Clark at first slip disposed of Wood, and at 39 Grierson bowled L. Alexander with a good length ball, which seemed to break in from the off. At 40 a rising ball put Quaife hors de combat for a time, and he took a rest. The home skipper made his first change at 44 with Clark for Grierson, and later Foy relieved Wharmby. The new bowler soon met with success, hitting Capt. Wilson's leg stump at 64 before any runs had been scored

off him. Four for 64. After a short rest Wharmby went on at the opposite end for Clark. Capt. Murray lifted his first ball to the off boundary, but off the second he was smartly snapped at the wickets by Apthorp. 75-5-5. Quaife now resumed his innings, but soon lost C. Alexander, who was bowled leg stump neck and crop by Grierson. 76-6-14. The visiting skipper now became associated with Quaife, and the pair remained together until the drawing of stumps for the day, despite several bowling changes, Cobbold's score standing at 28 and Quaife's at 8, and the total at 113.

THURSDAY'S PLAY.

The over-night not-outs quickly took the score to 151, when Cobbold was bowled by Grierson. This partnership much improved Suffolk's position, and their hopes were further brightened by a lengthy stand by Bennett and Quaife, who added 35. The 200 was signalled at 12.30, and Quaife completed his 50 in the same over. Then, at 206, Wharmby, with a beautiful length ball, hit Trudgett's middle stump, and at 217 Waters touched a rising ball, and Apthorp secured it behind the wicket. Bedfordshire thus led on the first innings by 37.

Bedfordshire had half an hour's batting before lunch. Early disaster waited upon them, for Holdstock, in attempting to cut the third ball sent down, got too far back, and tipped the top of his off peg. At 34, made in 22 minutes, King was taken at the wickets. He had played sparkling cricket for his 22. At lunch time Wharmby was not out 16, and the total 29 for two. Wharmby had only added four after lunch, when he was beaten by a ball which whipped in sharply and took his off stump. Four for 47. With Keenan partnering Willett, play became extremely quiet, and Cobbold, who was keeping a good length, soon gave Keenan his quietus for the second time. Then the Skipper came in, and began his chastise Cobbold. Willett, too, opened his shoulders more, and the spectators, who were now considerably augmented by the early closing community, enjoyed forty minutes delightful cricket. With his score at 49, Orr was taken at square leg. The total was then 121, and Apthorp and Willett proceeded to play Bedfordshire into safety. Apthorp, golfing the ball in all directions till he was bowled, when the total had reached 181. The sixth wicket had added 60. The end came with startling suddenness. Foy put a weak return into Cobbold's hands, and Willett was taken in the long field. With the next ball Cobbold bowled Clark. Grierson received a life off his second ball, being missed in the country, and then put the 200 up with a pretty leg glance. In the next over Wever lost his off-stump and the innings closed for 203.

SUFFOLK'S SECOND VENTURE.

Suffolk had an hour and fifty minutes in which to make the runs or get out. In the first 20 minutes they collected 13 and lost Hill-Wood to a magnificent catch by Clark at first slip. Play was then painfully slow, till there were 4 wickets down for 52, and fifty minutes to go. This revived interest, but the chances of a definite conclusion were dispelled by a half-an-hour's stand by Wilson and C. W. Alexander. At 6.15 the stumps were drawn, Bedfordshire having to be content with three points for their lead on the first innings.

Graham, of the Modern School, fielded for Mr. Orr in this innings, and Mr. Apthorp deputised as captain, as Mr. Orr was feeling the strain from a rick sometime ago. Graham's work in the slips was favourably commented upon. The fielding of both sides was good. Scores:—

BEDS. v. SUFFOLK.

Bedfordshire continued their Minor Counties Championship programme on Wednesday, when Suffolk were entertained on the Modern School ground. The weather was delightfully fine, and some interesting cricket was witnessed by a fair-sized crowd.

Winning the toss, the Beds. skipper elected to bat first on an excellent wicket, Holdstock and King opening against the bowling of Cobbold and Trudgett. After Holdstock had scored a single King was bowled. Wharmby was the new comer, but with 19 on the board the Luton pro. was smartly run out. Thirteen runs later Willett was out in a similar manner. With Keenan in runs came very slowly, the visitors backing up some good bowling by smart fielding. At 37 Waters relieved Trudgett, and in the next over Wharmby was out to a straight one from Cobbold. Upon Keenan being joined by Orr runs came freely, until the former was out to a neat catch at mid-on. Apthorp was the incoming batsman, and he and Orr were still unbeaten when the luncheon interval arrived, the score then being 103.

Upon the resumption runs came at a good pace, both batsmen scoring freely despite frequent changes in the bowling. Eventually Apthorp was out to a fine catch in the long field with the score at 183, the partnership having been productive of 137 runs. Upon being joined by Foy the skipper soon reached his century, and shortly afterwards the 200 appeared on the board. Fifteen runs later Foy was clean bowled by Trudgett, whilst Clark got in front of a straight one from Cobbold and was given out for obstruction. Wever soon settled on to scoring, but with 254 registered Orr was bowled by Trudgett. His innings of 136 was characterised by bright cricket, though he gave two chances—one at 3 and the second at 133. Included in his total were 13 fours. Grierson did not remain long, and the innings closed for 254.

O. H. Walters and S. Hill Wood were the opening batsmen for Suffolk. They scored freely, but when one short of 50 Wood was bowled by Wharmby. A few minutes later Walters was cleverly taken in the slips by Clark. Wickets fell at frequent intervals, and Suffolk had lost six men for 113 when stumps were drawn for the day.

The game was resumed on Thursday under less favourable climatic conditions. An overcast sky made the light bad, whilst there was a strong wind blowing. Cobbold and Quaife continued the Suffolk innings against the bowling of Orr and Wharmby. Twenty one runs were scored off the former's first two overs, after which he gave way to Grierson. The batsmen continued to hit freely, the scoring going up by leaps and bounds. Cobbold reached his fifty after half an hour's batting, following which he was neatly bowled by Grierson (151-7-53). The pair put on 74 for the seventh wicket. Clarke was put on vice Wharmby at the pavilion end, whilst the latter was given a trial at the town end, replacing Grierson. Bennett soon settled down to scoring. A loose one from Clark he drove in the direction of Wharmby, but the latter could not quite hold the ball. At 177 Foy was given a trial at the town end, though this did not keep the rate of scoring down. Eventually Bennett was out for obstruction in attempting to pull a good ball from Clark (186-8-10). Trudgett was the incoming batsman, and with the second ball he received he scored a couple. Wharmby relieved Foy. The second century went up after ninety minutes play, immediately after which Quaife completed his fifty with a fine hit to the leg. With 205 on the board Trudgett was bowled by Wharmby, and the innings closed for 217.

King and Holdstock opened the Beds. second venture to the deliveries of Cobbold and Trudgett, and in the former's first over he disposed of the professional. Then King and Wharmby took the score to 34 when the former had to retire caught. Wharmby was the next to go at 47, and Keenan followed him 5 runs later. Four for 52 was not a good prospect for the home side, but with the skipper and Willett together the fieldsmen had a busier time and they brought about a double bowling change, Wilson (slow) and Waters going on. Orr soon got into a very aggressive mood, boundary hits being frequent, and with Orr's 40 the century went up. When one short of his 50 the Beds. skipper was out to a hot catch, and this partnership had been a very useful one, putting on 69 runs. Apthorp was the incomer and opened his account with a couple, the ball being stopped nearly on the boundary. Runs were not coming so quickly, but with 130 on the board Wilson gave way to Trudgett, off whom Apthorp sent up the 140 with an on-boundary hit. Cobbold went on at the other end. For a time however Willett did most of the scoring. With his 40 secure Willett lifted Trudgett straight for the screen,

but the scouter misjudged the flight and could only touch it with his outstretched left hand. Five minutes later Willett reached his 50 with a three to long-off and was heartily applauded. In the next over Trudgett broke through Apthorp's defence and Foy went in, but quickly retired for a c and b. Clark got 3 with a snick, when Willett lifted Cobbold to long-off and was nicely caught. Grierson gave a chance off his first hit, and the innings soon closed.

At the conclusion of the game Suffolk had scored 90 for 5 wickets. Full score and analysis:—

Cricket News.

BEDFORDSHIRE v. SUFFOLK.

This Minor Counties' match was played at Bedford, on the Modern School ground, on Wednesday and Thursday. The great feature of the Bedfordshire innings was the dashing play of the home captain, who rose grandly to the occasion when his side was in a bad way. Mr Orr was missed when he had made three, but did not give another chance until he stood at 133, after which he only added three. The innings closed for 254, and, in response, Suffolk scored 217. As there was not time for a double innings each, Bedfordshire won on the first.

The home captain won the toss, and sent in W. E. King and Holdstock, to the bowling of P. W. Cobbold and Trudgett. Holdstock scored a single, and the fourth ball of the match saw King's stumps upset by Cobbold for a "duck." Wharmby came in and soon got going, but, with the score at 10, Holdstock was run out for four singles. H. Willett filled the vacancy, but he met with a similar fate to Holdstock, being run out by Walters hitting the stumps in a very smart return, after scoring three. Wharmby was the next to go, being clean bowled by Cobbold for 20, the score being 37. Nine runs later, N. Keenan had to leave, being caught by C. L. Alexander for six. H. R. Orr and E. E. Apthorp became associated, and soon stopped the rot. The first bowling change was then made, Walters and C. L. Alexander going on for Cobbold and Trudgett. They were still together at the luncheon interval, Orr being 44, and Apthorp 16; the total being 103 for five.

After lunch, the not-outs resumed to Wilson and Trudgett, the batsmen giving a delightful exhibition of free hitting. When the score was 183, the home stumper was caught at long-on by Walters, the bowler being Wilson, for 47, his hits including four 4's. This partnership put on 137 runs. P. A. Foy came in, and opened his account with a single to leg, and, at 3.20, the home skipper reached his century with a single past the bowler, amidst a storm of applause. With his next ball he hoisted the second century for Beds. The visiting captain was putting some tempting slows down, but the batsmen were careful. Foy sent 210 up with a pretty leg stroke for three, which stopped a foot short of the boundary. Trudgett went on for Cobbold, and Foy got him away for a couple, but, with the last ball of the over, he spread-eagled the Grammar boy's stumps for 11. L. Clark was the next batsman, and Trudgett bowled a "maiden" to him. Orr survived an appeal for stumping, and next sent 220 up with a couple on the leg. Clark opened his score with two through the slips, and the next two balls he got away for similar scores. Orr placed Cobbold to the boundary, and, after a single had been run, Clark got in front of one, and was given out lbw, the score being 238 for eight wickets. R. O. Wevor came in, the Elstow School boy getting a couple to leg with his first ball. When Orr reached 133 he was missed at mid-off, the total being 250. Trudgett next got the home captain's wicket, his contribution being 136, his hits including thirteen 4's, two 3's, and twenty-one 2's. It was a delightful effort and full of life. H. Grierson was the last man in, and his second ball he skied to C. W. Alexander at point, the innings closing at 4.10 for 254.

Suffolk started their venture at 4.30, with O. H. Walters and S. Hill Wood. Wharmby and Grierson opening the attack, the former getting a single to cover point, the next Wood sent for a three, and Walters got a boundary through the slips. Walters survived an appeal for stumping and the next ball for lbw. A drive for two sent 20 on the board. At 20, Wharmby took Hill Woods off stump for 9. Quaife, brother to the Warwickshire pro., filled the vacancy. Walters scored a boundary through the slips, but two balls later he was splendidly taken at first slip by Clark off Wharmby, the score being 36 for two. C. L. Alexander was bowled with a beauty from Grierson without scoring. Quaife was hit with a ball that got up badly, and had to retire, his score being three; and C. W. Alexander came in his place, opening his score with a couple past point. L. Clark replaced

Grierson at the Pavilion end at 44, the result of an hour's batting, his first ball beating the batsman and going for three byes. Foy took the ball from Wharmby and in his second over got Capt. Wilson's leg stump (four for 64). After a rest for three overs, Wharmby went on again for Clark, Capt. Murray hit his first ball to the off-boundary, and the next ball he was taken at the wicket by Apthorp. Quaife resumed again and got his third ball away for a single. Another bowling change was made, Grierson going on for Foy, and it immediately met with success, Grierson upsetting C. W. Alexander's leg peg with his fifth ball. The visiting captain scored a boundary with his first ball, sending 80 up. R. O. Wevor relieved Grierson at 93, Cobbold sending 100 up with an off drive. Stumps were shortly afterwards drawn for the day, the score being 113 for six wickets, Cobbold being not out 28 and Quaife not out 8.

SECOND DAY.

The not-outs resumed to Wharmby and Orr, and the total was taken to 151 before Cobbold was bowled by Grierson for 52. S. G. Bennett scored 10 before he was lbw. to Clark, and Trudgett put on 11 before Wharmby got through his defence. Waters, the last man, was caught at the wicket for 3, and the side were out for 217, Quaife being not out 58.

Bedfordshire started their second venture with King and Holdstock, and the latter was bowled by Cobbold with his third ball before he had scored. Wharmby came in and scored a boundary with his first shot. At 34 King was caught for 22, his hits including one five and two fours. Willett joined Wharmby, and the total was 30 when lunch was taken, Wharmby being not out 6.

After the interval, Cobbold and Trudgett were the bowlers, and Willett dispatched the first ball to the boundary. Wharmby was bowled when 20 by Trudgett, the score being 47. Keenan came in, and was beaten by Cobbold after scoring 5. On Orr joining Willett the score was taken from 52 to 183 before he was caught by Alexander. Willett played a very patient innings for his 61. The others did not give much trouble, and the side were all out for 203.

Suffolk wanted 245 to win when they started their second venture, just before five o'clock. Stumps were drawn just before 6.30, the visitors scoring 90 for 5 wickets. Scores:—
