CORNWALL v. DEVON.

DEVON WIN BY TWO WICKETS.

For this match at Camborne Devon were unable to place their strongest team in the field, but they managed to win by the narrow margin of two wickets. On account of the poor state of the wicket the match was finished off in six hours, during which time 33 wickets went down for 391 runs. The home county won the toss, and elected to bat. Misfortune quickly overtook them, the captain losing his wicket with only 12 registered, Capt. Waller beating him. At the other end Coates had charge of the ball, and with the score at 34 he succeeded in sending back W. N. Bickford-Smith, and also in catching Trevarthen in the slips from Capt. Waller without another run having been added. Lubbock, the latest arrival, was almost bowled by the army officer with a ball which he failed to time. In the next over from Capt. Waller the batsman hit hard, but some fine fielding at cover-point by Carroll kept down the score. The same bowler, however, soon brought about a separation by the Porthcurnow man returning one to him, which Capt. Waller held with one hand, though he fell in the effort. Four wickets were down for 38, and with the addition of 9 runs the fifth wicket went, J. C. Bickford-Smith being caught in the slips. There was an improvement in the batting, Lubbock and Harvey putting on 22 for the sixth wicket. Harvey was the batsman to go, and was lucky to have survived so long, for he had been beaten times out of number. Having come on in the place of Captain Waller, Aston succeeded in an appeal against Escott, this being the seventh wicket, for 75. The professional also succeeded in getting the next wicket, bowling Lubbock, who had made the best individual stand for his side. With Hawken and Vibart in the hundred went up. The scoring was very slow, Aston bowling a good length, and being almost unplayable. The ninth wicket produced another 22 runs, a change of bowling—Sturt for Coates—sending back the Cornish keeper. Another bowling change had to be made before the last wicket fell, and Hawken, with 31, had the honour of making the highest score for his side, who were all out for 132 before lunch. On the Devon side Captain Waller came out with the best analysis, viz., four for 22.

Devon started even more disastrously than Cornwall, losing five wickets for 59 runs, and all good bats. Orchard was caught behind the wicket with only 9 runs on, Lieut. Wilson following when another 9 had been registered. Light was next out with only 7 more runs added, putting a ball from Whiting up in the slips, which Hawken held from one of the brothers Bickford-Smith. Whiting and Hawken were bowling for Cornwall, and the latter was meeting with success. A brighter aspect came over the game with Carroll and Shelley together, both forcing the game and getting runs quickly. The wicket was in a bad state and bumping nastily, so the Devon batsmen tried to force the game. Carroll helped to put on 24, and was then out. Sturt stayed with Shelley whilst the latter hit out and made 24 out of 25, and then was caught at cover-point by Treawna after a second attempt. Only two more runs were put on, and Captain Waller came in, Devon having 85 for seven wickets down. With 87 on Whiting bowled Shelley, who had made 32, which included six 4's. Devon found themselves 13 runs behind the Cornish total, and their partial recovery was greatly due to Coates, who played a fine defensive game, and was out to a smart hit of stumping. Hawken came out with six wickets for 82.

Coates and Aston bowled for the visitors when Cornwall started their second innings, and the home county slumped as if for a small total. Three wickets were down for 9 runs, but Lubbock helped the score forward to 28, when he was smartly taken in the slips. Four wickets were down for 28, and without another run on the Cornish captain had the middle stump bowled down by Aston. The Services bowler did the same with Harvey in, Aston bowling in great form. Escott was also sent back by Aston, who had now five wickets for 11 runs. The Cornish innings soon closed for the moderate total of 63, Aston being responsible for five wickets for 19 runs, and Captain Waller two for 5. Devon were left to make 77 runs to win. In less than 15 minutes Light helped himself to 34, hitting a 6 and six 4's. But they lost seven more wickets in getting the runs, thus winning by only two wickets. Scores:—

MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

DEVON'S TWO-WICKET WIN AT CAMBORNE.

The match between Devon and Cornwall was opened and concluded at Camborne yesterday in fair weather. The Duchy having won the toss, W. U. Bickford Smith and H. Tressawna opened the batting against the bowling of Coates and Captain Waller. Tressawna's stand was only of a few minutes' duration, as Waller displaced his middle stump for 8. Trevarthen was then associated with Bickford Smith, who fell a victim to the bowling of Coates when he had put together 15, the score now standing at 34 for the loss of two wickets. Trevarthen's dismissal was soon brought about by Coates, the batsman only just creeping into double figures. Godrich had succeeded Bickford Smith at the wicket, and Lubbock took Trevarthen's place. Godrich made a quick return to the pavilion, being beautifully caught by Waller for 4. J. C. Bickford Smith succeeded Godrich, but he was unable to stem the tide that had set in against the homesters, being beautifully caught in the slips for 4. The loss of five wickets for 48 was now telegraphed. Harvey followed J. C. Bickford Smith, and this partnership witnessed the first change in the bowling, Aston going on in the place of Waller. Harvey added 10 when he was cleaned bowled by Coates, and so far 70 had been registered for the loss of six wickets after less than an hour's play. Escott was bowled by Aston for 4. Vibart next joined Lubbock at the wicket. Lubbock had up to this stage made the longest stay of all, but Aston bowled him when he had compiled the highest individual total, viz., 20. Hereabouts the century was reached. Vibart, sound and steady, gave promise of making a substantial contribution, but at 17 Sturt bowled him. The reading of the telegraph was 114 for nine. Hawken and Whiting brought up the rear and the former's thirty-one was the top score of the innings. By luncheon time Cornwall were all out for 132.

After lunch Devon commenced their first innings. The ill-prepared wicket had been playing badly all the morning, but when the Devonians went to it its condition was wretched. Devon indulged in hitting, and though several chances were not accepted, they were all out for 119. The top scorer was Shelly with 32, but Coates's was the best innings on the side. In their second innings the Cornishmen made only a poor show—63. After tea Devon entered upon their second venture, running up 77, and by 6.20 the match was over, the Devonians being the victors by two wickets. Scores and analyses—

MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

DEVON v. CORNWALL.

There was a good attendance of cricket enthusiasts at Boscar, Camberne, on Friday, when Devon and Cornwall met for the first time this season in the Minor Counties' Championship. Although the weather for the greater part of the day was propitious, the state of the pitch was such as to merit the condemnation of both teams. Many of the players characterised it as "wretched," and, judging by the performances of reputed batsmen, this judgment was not altogether out of place. The home county batted first, and were not long out of trouble. Waller bowled from the church end, and dismissed the Cornish skipper for 9. A stand was made by W. N. Bickford-Smith, but Coates found his on stump. Trevarthen succumbed to Capt. Waller, and Godrich was caught in the slips by Coates. Lubbock apparently courted disaster in the first over, but eventually he hit out well, and tested the fielding capabilities of the Devonians. Four wickets fell for 39, and when another 9 runs had been registered, J. O. Bickford-Smith was caught in the slips. Lubbock continued to play carefully and well, and his partnership with Harvey, though not devoid of a modicum of luck, was very creditable. Capt. Waller changed places with Aston, who secured an appeal against Escott, with whose dismissal the slate registered 75 for seven. After compiling 20, Lubbock was sent out by Aston. After this, scoring was somewhat slower, the bowling being almost unplayable. The ninth wicket resulted in a further 22 runs. With another change of bowlers, Hawken and Vibart maintained a good defence, but at length Hawken hit lightly, and Sturt handled. Hawken's 31 was the result of good cricket.

If Cornwall started badly, their opponents' opening was infinitely worse. To the bowling of Whiting and Hawken wickets fell in rapid succession, five being down for 59 runs. Wilson was missed early, but was eventually caught by W. N. Bickford-Smith after making a modest 10. Just after this Vibart caught Orchard behind the stumps. The next partnership was between Light and Davies. The former only notched 5 before succumbing to Hawken. Twenty minutes from the start, three wickets were down for 28 runs. Whiting dismissed Davies for 14, and just when Carroll was getting the measure of the bowling he was caught by Godrich. Shelley batted steadily and well, and his 32, which included six 4s, was deserved. The next best contributor to the Devon score was Coates, who was rather unfortunate in being stumped by the Cornish wicket-keeper. Up to this point the game was distinctly poor.

When the homesters commenced their second innings with an advantage of 13 runs, Coates and Aston played havoc with the batsmen, three wickets being sacrificed for a meagre 9 runs. Lubbock was beginning to shape well when he was caught in the slips. Four wickets were now down for 28 runs, and without adding a single run the home captain's centre stump fell to Aston. Harvey succeeded in adding seven ere Aston got him with a beauty. The same bowler dismissed Escott for nothing, and Hawken and Vibart having put on 13 between them, the innings closed for a disappointing 63, which left Devon 77 to win. A speedy end to the match seemed to be in prospect, but the victory was not quite so easy as many anticipated. What followed was by far the best cricket for the day, a capital stand being made by Wilson and Light, whose partnership accounted for 48 runs. After this, however, a rut set in, runs being few and far between. Shelley proved a thorn in the side of the Cornish bowlers, until caught in the slips. Orchard having been run out through a stupid blunder, it remained for three wickets to score half-a-dozen runs. Tamworth and Coates failed to score, but Capt. Waller effected the coup de grace with a splendid straight drive to the boundary. Scores:—

MINOR COUNTIES COMPETITION.
DEVON v. CORNWALL.

The meeting of these teams at Camborne was commenced and completed on Friday owing to the wretched condition of the wicket, which was described by several players as the worst they had ever played on. Early on the pitch began to crumble, and when Devon went in it went to pieces, and it was impossible to judge the course of the ball after it left the pitch. Several players received nasty knocks, and Vibart's display behind the wicket was described as one of real pluck. Early on he was struck in the face, but he stood close up to the wicket throughout the match. The outfield was also ill-prepared, and the ground around the wicket had to be cut just before the game started. The action of the County Committee in allotting two county matches to Camborne is not meeting with the support from the local club which it merits.

Cornwall won the toss, and half the side were out for 48. Lubbock, Vibart, and Hawken pulled the game round by sound and steady batting, the Lanhydrock man hitting with rare freedom, and was last man out to a wrong decision, being caught off a ball which he chopped into the slips.

Devon opened none too well. Wilson was missed twice in successive balls off Hawken, but Vibart got Orchard behind the wickets, and Wilson was taken in the slips with the score at 15. Light put a ball high up in the slips, and Bickford-Smith got his fingers to the ball and Hawken completed the catch. Carroll and Shelley went in for hitting, and put on runs at a rapid rate till Carroll fell to a bad stroke in the slips. Shelley was missed in the long field, and 80 runs were put on after 45 minutes' play. Sturt fell to a brilliant one-hand catch by Tresawna at cover-point, and Escott dismissed Waller with a fine catch. Shelley was missed at point, but Whiting beat him with a beauty, and the ninth wicket fell at 88. Both the last batsmen were missed in the field, but Coates was smartly stumped by Vibart with the score 13 behind the home total.

In the second innings Cornwall were dismissed for 68, and Devon were left with 77 runs to make, and 75 minutes left for play. Light and Wilson put on 48 for the first wicket, and the fifth wicket fell at 68, but the visitors took half-an-hour and lost three wickets before making the other nine runs. The game concluded at 8.15 in a win for Devon by 2 wickets. Scores:—

CORNWALL v. DEVON.

Devon opened a two days' match in connection with the Minor Counties' Championship at Camborne on Monday against Cornwall, after defeating Monmouth by one wicket on Monday. Cornwall won the toss, and W. N. Bickford-Smith and H. Tressawna faced the bowling of Coates and Capt. Waller. Tressawna treated Coates' first over carefully, but the first ball in his second over he sent to boundary. Waller's first ball against Tressawna took the latter's middle stump. This was five minutes from the start. Tressawna's contribution was 9. Trewarthen partnered Bickford-Smith, and the former's second hit went to boundary. Bickford-Smith's first hit of any note was a boundary off Coates. Bickford-Smith was clean bowled by Coates when he had made 15, which included two boundaries. The score now read 32 for two wickets. Godrich was the next to go in. Trewarthen was neatly caught by Coates off Waller two minutes later, after adding 10 to the score. Lubbock had only five minutes' play with Godrich when the latter was splendidly caught and bowled by Waller. Godrich's score was 4. In half-an-hour from the commencement of the game, Cornwall had lost four wickets for 40 runs. Lubbock was partnered by J. C. Bickford-Smith, and the former's first hit from Coates went to boundary. After making 4, Bickford-Smith's place, and careful play was the order of the game. Runs came slowly, until Harvey made a couple of boundaries. Aston took Waller's place as bowler. After making 10, Harvey was bowled by Coates. The telegraph now read 70 runs for 6 wickets. G. Escott followed Harvey, and the former made a quick return to the pavilion. He was lbw to Aston after making 4. Vibart next went in, and he played with freedom and vigour. Lubbock retired from Aston's bowling after notching 20. Eight wickets were down for 90 runs. Hawken and Vibart freely made the pace, and soon a century was registered. Vibart was bowled by Sturt after amassing 17. With one wicket more to fall the score read 114. Vibart's innings showed pretty cricket, and his judgment was sound, scoring only off loose balls. Whiting was the last man to go in, and from the first ball by Waller. Hawken was caught by Sturt, after making 81, which included five boundaries.

After lunch, Lieut. Wilson and Orchard opened the innings for Devon. They faced the bowling of Hawken and Whiting. The visitors gave a bad display at the start. Wilson was missed off successive balls when he had not opened his score sheet, but when reaching ten, he was caught by W. N. Bickford-Smith. Orchard was caught by Vibart behind the stumps a few minutes later, and Light and Davies became partners with the score at 18. Light was dismissed by a smart catch by Hawken from Whiting's bowling when he made five. Three men were out for 23, twenty minutes after the restart. Five minutes later Davies was beautifully bowled by Whiting after making 14. Carroll and Shelly made runs freely, and it was not long before half a century was registered from first rate cricket. Carroll was caught in the slips by Godrich. Sturt was also caught by Tressawna. The score now stood at 84. Capt. Waller's innings was of short duration.
