THE TRAVESTY OF CRICKET.

The lords of three-day cricket have humbled themselves before the idol of gladiatorialism. Three summers hence we shall have nine of the sixteen weeks of the cricket season consumed by Triangular Tests. It is assumed that the executive of the scheme will not be trying the public so high as to play more than one Test in any one week; such a trial would be overstraining the nerves of the Gladiators; the gate money might be affected. Let us be frank. Is not at least one very big eye—one that reminds us of the weird "Nunquam dormio" on the front page of old Bell's Life—set on the "gate" when Test cricket is discussed? In the elaborate scheme issued from Lord's the manner of the collection and distribution of profits absorbs as much space as the outline of the cricket scheme.

Proude tells somewhere in the "Queen's Prime Ministers" that one of the most famous, on being told that the bells were ringing for the declaration of war, observed that the public would soon be wringing its hands. And so those who, in the intoxication of their joy on conversion to Mr. Abe Bailey's scheme for the English cricket grounds, may awaken to find that in their Test delirium they have stabbed county cricket. The blow has been given when county cricket had need of nutriment; its blood had been weakened by golf and over-professionalism; here is the great county of Surrey reduced to a wholly professional side; here is Middlesex parted with its glories. Not even Australian importation has given either Surrey or Middlesex its old stand in cricket. And yet it is doubtful whether club cricket in quantity and quality in any part of England can compare with that of Surrey and Middlesex—and Kent (we had almost forgotten Kent). Kent stands by itself in cricket. It is the last of the strongholds where three-day cricket is played for cricket's sake.

There would be everything to say for these Tests were they merely Tests of sportsmanship between amateurs with a slight leaven of professionalism. Their development spells more professionalism than ever. We have every admiration for our colonial kinsmen, for their grit, for their intense skill; but they themselves make no secret of their financial ideas in these trips. And in the circumstances it is as well that the Triangular tournament should not have too heavy a setting of sport—let's strain a point and say that it is half finance and half sport. The smaller counties may gain something in the division of the spoils, but they will lose something by the inevitable contraction of the county fixtures that must be a corollary of the presence of two colonial teams in one season.

Our Test cricket this season is rather unfortunate for the Triangular company which is disposing of the remaining glories of county cricket with all the hilarity with which Charles Surface got rid of his ancestors. We doubt if they were pressed whether they would hold the little portrait of Oliver in the shape of the 'Varsity match. It is with them a case of Test—and after that Test. And all this for such travesty of real cricket as England played at Lord's, Headingley, and Old Trafford. Some of us will begin to think that this fate in the Tests is merely the retributive requirement for the debasement of a great game from a sport to a fanaticism.

BEDFORDSHIRE v. HERTFORDSHIRE.

On Friday and Saturday Bedfordshire visited St. Albans to play the return match with Hertfordshire. The usual early season difficulties of collecting a representative side were accentuated by the inability of E. E. Apthorp, H. Squire, Grierson and Fry to play, and more fresh material had to be unearthed. Their troubles were not much assuaged when they discovered that once again Dame Nature had presented White with just the wicket he loves, and a very bad light in which to operate. In all White's ingathering of wickets was a mere trifle of 17 for 71. He and Coleman bowled unchanged through both innings. Even Coleman, a fast bowler, made the ball break appreciably, while White manipulated it at will, breaking from the off or on little or much as he willed. But having made allowance for all this, Bedfordshire's batting was lamentably weak. They tried to play the bowling, whereas in all probability more enterprize would have been more effective. Only King, Orr and Holdstock seemed to realise this. Herts, however, realised it, and although the wicket had improved only very slightly, when they batted, they went for the bowling. For instance in Gausson's 30 were five consecutive fours, Coleman had five fours in his 42, and R. B. Cowley also hit out to purpose. The latter was missed by Orr at mid-off, when he had made three. His partnership with Coleman carried the score from 64 to 139 for the seventh wicket. Orr captured his four wickets very cheaply, viz., for 10 runs, but afterwards was treated severely, 41 more being hit off him in seven overs. Linnell bowled well.

In the return match with Bedfordshire at St. Albans last week-end Hertfordshire were lucky to meet a much weaker side than that which made so good a fight with them at Bedford. But it is by no means to this cause alone that the visitors can attribute their crushing defeat. When a side containing such batsmen as H. R. Orr, Wharmby, Holdstock (who made a hundred in the first match), H. Willett and W. E. King is dismissed for 58 runs, and 13 is the highest individual score, it is reasonable to give the credit to the bowlers. The wicket helped White a great deal, no doubt, but batting under exactly similar conditions the home county put together the respectable total of 188. The difference between the results of the two innings, therefore, may fairly be attributed to the greater excellence of the Bedfordshire bowling.

White, who of late has simply been performing wonders with the ball, took eight wickets in Bedfordshire's first innings for 35 runs, and he was, as usual, well backed up by Coleman. Unsuspected to him as the wicket was, the fast bowler had to be watched very closely all through, and eight of his 14 overs were maidens. The home county early lost J. N. Cowley, who in the absence of Butcher went in first with Golding; but the latter kept up his wicket while H. L. Gausson, his next partner, forced the pace. When the amateur was taken at the wicket for a useful 30 the total was only a dozen short of Bedfordshire's; and although C. H. Titchmarsh (who appears to be reserving his first big score of the season for the Hitchin ground) also fell a victim to Orr's slows, when rain stopped play on the Friday the home side were in the happy position of wanting but 9 runs to beat their opponents and had seven wickets in hand.

On Saturday for a time things went in favour of Bedfordshire, Golding only doubling his overnight score of 7 and White being got rid off for an equal addition to the score. Afterwards, however, everything went well for Hertfordshire, R. B. Cowley rattling up 50, as he had done against Cambridgeshire, and Coleman laying about him with equal effect. With E. L. Wright and the captain also making a few the home county gained a first innings lead of 130.

Of the Bedfordshire bowlers Orr took most wickets—four for 51 runs, but McLinnell (three for 16) had much the best analysis. King, Clark and Wharmby each got a wicket, at a cost respectively of 21, 39 and 41 runs.

The task of wiping off the arrears proved altogether beyond the visitors' powers. White again carried all before him, nine wickets for 39 being his record for the innings—bringing his total for the match up to 17 for 74. Thus in two successive Minor Championship games the West Herts professional and Coleman bowled unchanged through two innings—a really remarkable feat. On the Bedfordshire side only W. E. King and Keenan got into double figures. The good bowling was backed up by some smart work in the field, and by their all-round play Hertfordshire thoroughly deserved the points won.

Bedfordshire undoubtedly suffered by the absence of H. Grierson and P. A. Foy, the Bedford Grammar School bowlers, due to a school fixture with The Leys, Cambridge. The claims of business kept H. Squire out of the eleven, and E. E. Apthorp, who had scored so freely in the county's earlier engagements, was also unable to play. As substitute for the last-named H. C. Potter did exceedingly well behind the stumps, though meeting with very little success with the bat.

The recent good form of the county eleven ought to ensure the presence of a large number of spectators on the Hitchin ground during the trial of skill with Lincolnshire; and our cricketing readers will not forget that the proceeds of this game will be taken by Coleman, of Kimpton, who is being given a benefit.

Three Hitchin men are included in the home eleven—H. Williams, E. L. Wright and Brown. Williams's selection was thoroughly deserved, as there is no batsman in the district of equal ability, and perhaps no player of equal all-round skill, although in the latter respect Brown may run him close. Williams has played for Hertfordshire before, but never on the Hitchin ground, where so many of his big scores have been made, and Hitchin people will be much interested to see how he fares on this occasion.

It is a good side which is representing Hertfordshire, although one is sorry to miss the names of Dr. A. E. Clarke and R. B. Cowley. It is particularly strong in bowling, as besides Coleman and White there are available as changes Marsh, Brown, Williams, Golding and Wright. The eleven names are:—H. M. Harford (captain), E. H. Cuthbertson, H. L. Gausson, W. H. Marsh, C. H. Titchmarsh, H. Williams and E. L. Wright, with Brown, Coleman, Golding and White.
