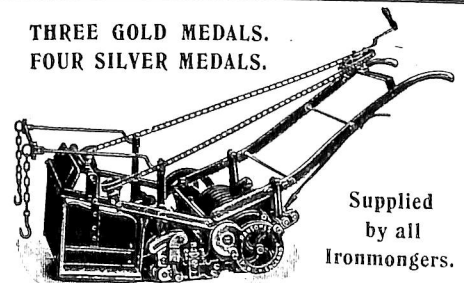

CAPITAL CRICKET. MONMOUTHSHIRE IN A GOOD POSITION. ADMIRABLE BATTING BY E. S. PHILLIPS.

Result of corresponding match last year.—Monmouthshire, 140 and 201; Glamorgan, 178 and 148. Glamorgan won by 84 runs. With an admirable innings of 130, E. S. Phillips helped to place Monmouthshire in a sound position in their match with Glamorgan, who, with half their wickets down at the close, still required 111 runs to avert arrears on the first innings.

This was the first county fixture for both clubs, who were well represented. There was a fairly good attendance when the match started on the Newport enclosure on Tuesday in dull weather, which threatened rain at any moment. Monmouthshire won the toss, and started with Silverlock and M. Stratton. The play was ably assisted by Bancroft in the slips off Nash, who shared the bowling with Creber. This came with the second ball of the match, when only a single had been registered. E. S. Phillips then joined Stratton, who, however, left with the score at 25, easily taken at point on Creber. T. B. Williams followed, and the score was carried to 44 when Williams had his middle stump shot down by Nash. The new comer, Diver, was uneasy to commence with, but afterwards batted with more confidence. When the total had reached 72 Maxwell came on instead of Creber. In the last ball of his first over he took Diver's leg stump clean out of the ground. The partnership put on 31 runs. Phillips continued to make runs, and sent up his 50 with a single. With the next ball his partner, David, sent up the 100, after an hour and three-quarters' play. With 6 runs added David, who had been playing a defensive game, fell a victim to Bancroft in the slips. Weight, who was next to partner E. S. Phillips, gave Nash a fairly easy chance in the slips, but was let off. By steady cricket the total was then carried to 141 before Weight was sent back by Hacker, who had come on vice Nash.

FINE INNINGS BY E. S. PHILLIPS. With Gordon Phillips and E. S. Phillips together some pretty and during cricket was seen. The new comers hit out fearlessly at almost everything. There had been 50 added in about thirty minutes when, at 131, Gordon Phillips lifted a ball from Nash, who had come on again for Hacker, and was caught, having compiled a good 50 runs. E. S. Phillips, with a nice cut past the slips, sent up his century amid applause after being three hours and five minutes at the wicket. There was another quickening of the pace when W. A. Williams came in to bat. Both men played nicely round the wicket, and added 77 runs before Williams's place was taken by Stedman. E. S. Phillips's total now stood at 130, and Stedman, hitting Maxwell for 3, gave him the bowling. Immediately he gave a tinging chance to Hacker in the slips, but the Methy ball man dropped the ball like a hot coal. The next ball sent down, however, separated the Monmouthshire skipper's sticks, and brought the innings to a close for 137. E. S. Phillips had only given one chance in his innings, during which he hit fifteen 4s. It was, indeed, a capital performance. He took matters very seriously, and played with great care and judgment when it looked as though his side were going to be disposed of rather cheaply.

USEFUL STAND FOR GLAMORGAN. At 4.35 N. V. H. Riches and T. A. L. Whittington started the Glamorgan innings, facing Silverlock and F. G. Phillips. They set up a good pace at the start, but a drizzling rain, look like bringing play for the day to an early close. When the total had reached 37 Riches was smartly taken by David at point off Gordon Phillips. Whittington was doing damage to several bowlers, and looked like a fixture, until he snicked a ball to the slips. Though it was very low, Silverlock got down to it nicely, rolling upon the ground in order to make sure of his catch. Sweet-Escott was then partitioned by Bancroft, and runs came at a better pace. They treated all bowlers alike, and gave nothing away, until 99 had been added, bringing the total to 138, Bancroft, who had been scoring the faster of the two, was caught by Diver behind the wicket. Two runs later E. R. Sweet-Escott was displaced with a neat catch by Gordon Phillips, who also accounted for Symonds with a nice one-handed catch. Clough and Maxwell were together with the total at 160 when stumps were drawn. Scores:—

SPLENDID BATTING AT NEWPORT. GLAMORGAN MAKE A FINE RECOVERY. CAPITAL STAND BY BANCROFT AND SWEET-ESCOTT.

Result of corresponding match last year.—Monmouthshire, 140 and 201; Glamorgan, 178 and 148. Glamorgan won by 84 runs.

The second day's play in the Glamorgan v. Monmouthshire match was commenced at Newport on Wednesday in dull, breezy weather. As the result of the opening day's play Monmouthshire scored 237, while Glamorgan were still 127 behind with five wickets down. Clough and Maxwell, the two not outs, continued on an easy wicket. The former added only three runs, when he was taken by E. S. Phillips off Stedman. Gibson's stay was short. He sent a ball to Diver behind the wicket when he had only scored a single. Maxwell played with care, but only seven runs were added, and the Glamorgan innings closed for 132, leaving them 105 runs behind. L. G. Stedman took four wickets for 55 and F. G. Phillips three for 43. A few minutes after twelve o'clock Monmouthshire started their second innings to the bowling of Nash and Maxwell. At 21 Maxwell sent a ball down on the leg side to Stratton, who slipped it to Hacker in the slips. Silverlock and E. S. Phillips played careful cricket, carrying the score to 43, when Nash nicely bowled Silverlock. Two runs later Nash got out to T. B. Williams, and in quick time, for 24 runs, scored two more wickets. Monmouthshire were in a bad way after the luncheon. E. S. Phillips and Weight scored at a good pace. A bowling change might have been useful, as the total had reached 130 with the same two bowlers on. When the change did come, however, it was effective. The batsmen slugged out very nicely, and forced the game, and the innings closed for 322. Nash took five wickets for 76 runs, and Hacker three for 13.

Glamorgan had two hours and 35 minutes to make up the difference when Whittington and Sweet-Escott opened the second innings, to the bowling of F. G. Phillips and W. A. Williams. They quickly settled down, and played all bowlers with good variety. The total had reached 55 before Whittington sent up a clever frocked batsman to mid-on, T. B. Williams getting under it nicely. Bancroft next joined Sweet-Escott, and by patient play the century was reached in an hour and a quarter. When Bancroft had compiled 75 he gave a chance to Weight in the long-lead, but was let off. In the next over, however, he was caught by Silverlock off W. A. Williams. When Sweet-Escott was 70 he gave an easy chance to Hadden at cover-point, but was missed. Symonds was the new-comer, and the batsmen made a nice spurt. In the last half-hour they put on 48 runs with stylish play. Glamorgan had put on 220 for two wickets, being then 87 runs behind at the fall of time, and the match resulted in a win for Monmouthshire on the first innings. Complete scores:—

TO-DAY'S CRICKET.

MONMOUTHSHIRE v. GLAMORGANSHIRE.

Match at Newport To-Day.

CENTURY BY E. S. PHILLIPS.

Monmouthshire and Glamorganshire commenced a two days' match at Newport to-day in the minor counties' championship, in threatening weather, and before a fairly good attendance, for so early an hour. Both sides were fully represented, and, providing the rain held off, there was every reason to expect that the wicket, which was in capital order, would wear well.

Winning the toss, Monmouthshire started with Silverlock (pro.) and M. Stratton, but with only one run scored, the pro. was finely caught low down in the slips by Bancroft off Nash, who had started the bowling with Creber. E. S. Phillips filled the vacancy, but only 24 runs had been added before Stratton was easily taken by Gibson off Creber.

T. B. Williams filled the vacancy, and run-getting was slow, neither batsman being able to take liberties with the bowling, and the score had only been advanced to 44 when Williams was clean beaten by Nash.

Diver then joined Phillips, who was batting very carefully, and the half-century was soon telegraphed, whilst the total was steadily increased to 79, when Maxwell took the ball from Creber. The change had the desired effect, for, with the last ball of his first over, Maxwell shot Diver's leg stump out of the ground. Diver had made some good hits, and had helped Phillips to add 37 runs for the fourth wicket.

This let in M. David, who played carefully, to give Phillips a chance of reaching his fifty. This "E. S." did amid applause, and the century was telegraphed directly afterwards. However, David was caught in the slips at 106, and L. H. Weight, who succeeded him, ought to have been similarly caught off the second ball he received. The score at the luncheon interval was 114 for five wickets, and E. S. Phillips had 54 to his credit.

When play was resumed after lunch E. S. Phillips and L. H. Weight showed good form, and brought on Hacker for Nash. The change effected a separation, for, at 141, Weight was bowled for a useful 15. E. S. Phillips continued to bat well, and when joined by his brother, F. G., another useful stand was made.

Scores:

The brothers Phillips hit out merrily and added exactly 50 runs before Gordon was caught off Nash, who had just previously relieved Hacker. The retiring batsman had hit freely and had enlivened the proceedings considerably. With W. E. C. Hudden in the scoring again become slow, Hudden apparently being content to keep his end up and let Phillips do the scoring. Applause greeted the telegraphing of the second century, but with seven runs added Hudden was bowled.

With W. A. Williams in, E. S. Phillips quickly completed his century, a performance which called forth a hearty and well-deserved cheer.

The score was carried to 274, when W. A. Williams was caught after a rather lucky 37. With L. F. Stedman in E. S. Phillips looked like carrying out his bat. However, after cutting a ball into the clouds of Hacker, who dropped it, he was bowled by Maxwell and the innings closed for 277. E. S. Phillips's innings was one of the best he had ever played for Newport or the country. His score of 150 included 13 fours and in addition to showing great judgment at a time when it was needed, he hit splendidly when ever occasion offered. He had a very hearty reception on returning to the pavilion.

Glamorgan started their innings at 4.30 with Norman Riches and T. A. L. Whittington, the bowlers being Silverlock and W. A. Williams.

Second Day's Play.

THE VISITORS' HEAVY TASK.

Play was resumed at Newport this morning in this two days' match, when the weather was dull with a chilly wind blowing. The overnight not-outs, Clough and Maxwell continued their innings, but neither they nor the remaining Glamorgan men did very much, and the innings closed for 182, or 105 runs behind. No fewer than eight of the visitors were out to catches, and one was run out. L. F. Stedman was the most successful of the home bowlers, claiming four wickets at a cost of 55 runs. F. G. Phillips had three for 45.

Being over 100 runs behind, Glamorgan might have had to follow on, but the Monmouthshire captain elected to take the second knock first. M. Stratton, Silverlock and T. B. Williams were disposed of for 45, but E. S. Phillips again showed good form at a time when Nash was bowling very effectively. When the luncheon interval arrived the score was 95 for five wickets.

After lunch L. H. Weight put on runs at a good pace, and helped E. S. Phillips to carry the score to 130 before he was taken at the wicket for a capital 39.

At length E. S. Phillips's innings was brought to a close. As on Tuesday, he had played splendid cricket, combining careful play at a critical time with fine hitting when occasion offered. Hudden, W. A. Williams, and L. F. Stedman all scored freely towards the close, and Glamorgan were left with 307 runs to get to win.

With about two and a half hours in which to play, Glamorgan started their second innings with Whittington and Sweet-Escott. Despite frequent changes in the bowling the batsmen scored 55 before Whittington was caught.

Bancroft succeeded Whittington, and despite various changes in the bowling, he and Sweet-Escott batted in fine style.
