A Match Abandoned.

Berkshire generally face badly against Surrey in, but this year the elements came to the rescue, the match having to be abandoned. Still, the Berkshire men made a much better fight on this occasion, and were practically on level terms with 7 wickets in hand when stumps were drawn. Surrey, however, secured three points out of the five by reason of their lead on the first innings. A good first wicket stand by Sir C. Nepean and A. P. Strange put Berkshire on good terms with themselves, Strange being the first Berkshire batsman this season to reach his fifty. W. O. Hubbard was also a success, but, as before mentioned, Hawkesworth had to retire hurt, having at the time 16 runs to his credit. With Hawkesworth on the injured list the bulk of the attack fell on Shoosmith, Hubbard, and Simpson. The first-named captured 3 wickets for 80, while Simpson was quite a success with 4 for 40. It is a pity that H. J. Tutty, the Parkside favourite, was only given 5 overs, but in those he captured a wicket for 17 runs. The Surrey total was 274, Platt contributing 31, so that Berkshire were 104 in arrears. Berkshire's second innings was again noticeable for good batting by Sir C. Y. Nepean and A. P. Strange. "Rat" is in quite his best form.

MINOR COUNTIES' CHAMPIONSHIP.

SURREY 2nd XI. v. BERKSHIRE.

INTERESTING PLAY AT REIGATE.

Berkshire played the Surrey 2nd XI. on the Priory Ground at Reigate on Friday and Saturday in the Minor Counties' Championship. They brought with them a representative team, while the home county was fairly strongly represented, and included H. Brooker, the Reigate Priory football left winger. Berks won the toss and found a somewhat fast and easy going wicket, but the fielding of the Surrey eleven being remarkably good they were unable to run up a bigger score than 170.

For Berkshire Sir C. Y. Nepean and A. P. Strange faced the bowling of Webb and Platt. With twenty runs on the board Edwards displaced Webb. The score having risen to 32 Nepean was clean bowled by Platt. Strange soon lost Wichelow, only a single being added to the score. G. E. Williams played good cricket for 10 when Edwards took his middle stump (8 for 46). Shoosmith was the fifth man in, but he had only scored a single when Vigar smartly caught him at the wicket. Hawkesworth, the newcomer, hit out pretty freely, and at 75 Blackledge relieved Edwards, and later Jackson was put on for Platt.

ACCIDENT TO HAWKESWORTH.

The century was reached after an hour and 55 minutes' play and shortly afterwards an unfortunate accident occurred. Hawkesworth was making a run when Brooker returned the ball with considerable force. Hawkesworth was struck on the head and fell to the ground like an ox. He was taken to the Pavilion, and Dr. Freeman was soon in attendance. In the fall Hawkesworth's right shoulder was badly wrenched, and he had to retire from the game, having contributed a useful 16. W. O. Hubbard joined Strange, and at luncheon the score was 109 for four. Resuming, the play was of a more interesting character. Hubbard had scored 30 when he was caught by Ratty,

his total including six fours (six for 150). The score was taken to 144, when Strange was caught by Jackson after making 88. He was at the wicket for 2 hours and three-quarters, and his total included five fours. Tutty, who had taken Hubbard's place at 157, was caught, and Captain Rowe and Barrett, the pair in the field, were soon afterwards separated, the latter being caught without any addition being made to the total. Simpson was the last man in, and the pair brought the total up to 170, when Simpson was smartly caught by Jackson.

SURREY GO IN.

Jewell and Brooker opened for Surrey to the bowling of Shoosmith and Hubbard, the former hitting out merrily for his 20, when he was bowled by Hubbard, and the first wicket went for 34. Abel (W.) was the newcomer, and in a short time he got hold of the bowling, and in one of Shoosmith's overs knocked up 19 runs, and later he put on another baker's dozen off Hubbard. With 89 on the board there was a change of bowlers, Simpson doing duty for Hubbard. At 92 Brooker fell to a catch off Shoosmith after making 22. Abel was joined by Blackledge, but in the next over he was taken at point by Tutty. Abel's contribution was 39, and it included seven fours, his drive being very spirited. Blackledge's life was of short duration. Vigar and Edwards added a little life to the game, but with Platt having A. W. E. Ratty as a partner the pair drove Simpson to the boundary several times, and Hubbard was given the ball. Platt hit all round the wicket, and knocked up 50 in less than half an hour, while Ratty had made 17, when he was caught by Simpson, the score then being 104 for seven.

SURREY BATTING WELL.

Platt was joined by that promising young cricketer, Abel (G.). Although he appeared a little nervous at the commencement he settled down in a style typical of his father, and was heartily cheered for the display he gave. He ran up the useful score of 29 before he was caught. The partnership was dissolved in the first place by Platt being caught for 81. Not only did Platt prove himself a destructive bowler, but as a batsman he was equally successful. His 81 comprised 13 fours. The fall was made up by Jackson and Webb, the latter of whom was soon dismissed without having scored. Stumps were then drawn, the fielding on the part of Berks having been weak.
