Devonshire opened their match with Monmouthshire at Newport yesterday, the home team making a poor start on a wicket rendered rather easy by a night's rain. L. Robathan was top scorer for his side, making 31 before he was caught by Davies off Light. Hooman and Boles, who started for Devonshire, played very carefully, the wicket having become more difficult. The former made several good drives before he was dismissed. Sturt, however, made the best stand, scoring 38 not out, the innings closing for 119. DEVON DEFEAT MONMOUTH BY NINE WICKETS.

Play was resumed in this minor counties match at Newport on Saturday. Overnight, Monmouthshire, who were 13 ahead on the first innings, had lost seven wickets for 25. Play was not possible till after lunch, and then F. Gordon Phillips went in with the not out M. Stratton. Captain Christian and Lieutenant Boles continued the bowling, and at 31 Stratton played on to the latter. At 34 Williams hit out at Christian, and Roche brought off a very fine running catch, which sent down the ninth wicket. K. C. Halkes was last man in, and at 44 Gordon Phillips played a ball on to Light, and was finely held. Devonshire therefore required 58 runs to win.

Devonshire started their second innings with Hooman and Boles facing the deliveries of W. A. Williams and Silverlock. Monmouthshire showed great keenness in the field, but in spite of this the batsmen were apparently masters of the situation, and played with great confidence. Hooman, however, was twice let off, once by Watkins at extra cover, and once by H. N. King, fielding substitute for Frank Rees—the latter a very hot chance. At 25 Gordon Phillips went on for W. A. Williams, and in his first over Boles was caught in the slips by Robathan—one for 28. Hooman and Light soon knocked off the remaining runs, and Devonshire won by nine wickets. GOOD BOWLING BY D. C. BOLES.

This Minor Counties match commenced at Newport yesterday in threatening weather. Monmouth won the toss and made 132 runs at their first venture. They shaped rather poorly on the easy wicket, but after seven wickets were down for 83 Robathan and Watkins put on 43 runs for the eighth wicket. Devon started batting with Hooman and Boles, and the former hit well after a slow start, but was neatly caught at forward square leg at 23. Light hit hard and scored well till brilliantly run out by E. S. Phillips, who picked up marvelously and threw in quick and accurately to Williams, who took the ball and swept off the bats with one movement. Thus two wickets were down for 59. The next wicket went down at 66, also in consequence of a brilliant throw in by E. S. Phillips. Roche and Shelley were both dismissed at 72, and at 79 Davies, who had made 14 quickly, was caught off Silverlock after skying a ball to mid-on. With W. S. Sturt in the position was interesting, as it was a question whether Devon would lead on the first innings. The score mounted to 112, and then Silverlock tempted Janworth, and Diver stumped him. With one run added Diver caught the Hon. D. Scott off Williams. Capt. Christian was last man in, but Sturt, after giving 200 stump chances in two overs, was smartly caught at the wicket, and the innings closed for 119, or 13 runs behind. Monmouth had nearly an hour to bat again, and in that time lost seven wickets for 25 runs. The men could do nothing with Boles, who when wickets were drawn had taken six wickets for 15 runs. DEVONIANS WIN BY NINE WICKETS.

At Newport overnight Monmouth, who led on the first innings by 13 runs, had lost seven wickets for 25 in their second venture, and when play was possible after lunch on Saturday the innings was soon concluded. Capt. Christian and Lieut. Boles again took up the bowling, and the not-out, M. Stratton, was joined by F. G. Phillips, but with only six runs added the former was beaten by Boles, and played on. W. A. Williams hit out at Christian, but Roche brought off a great catch. Gordon Phillips was similarly tempted by Christian, and Light took a hard chance finely at mid-on. So the innings closed for 44, which left Devon with the modest task of compiling 59 to win. No change in the order was made, and from the moment C. V. L. Hooman and D. C. Boles faced the deliveries of Silverlock and W. A. Williams they played with the greatest confidence, though they took no unnecessary risks. Once Hooman gave a chance to Evan Watkins at extra cover, and soon after he cut a ball hard to a substitute holding at backward point in place of E. Rees, but the ball went through his hands. At 29 Boles cut a ball from Gordon Phillips into the hands of Robathan at second slip, and that brought in light. He immediately began to hit; 50 was soon reached, and Devon won by nine wickets, after batting for less than three quarters of an hour. Scores:—

AN UNLUCKY NUMBER.

MONMOUTHSHIRE, LEADING BY 13, FAIR DISASTROUSLY.

Result of corresponding match last year:—Monmouthshire won by 113 runs.

At Newport on Friday was started the return match to the one played at Exeter on July 12 and 13, when Devon won in rather a sensational manner by one wicket. Heavy rain overnight and in the morning made the pitch soft, but a drying wind and sun made play possible before noon. Monmouthshire won the toss, and sent in Silverlock and M. Stratton to combat with the bowling of Captain Christian and Lieutenant Boles. The wicket was slow and sticky. Silverlock was caught in the slips at 8, and Stratton was then partnered by E. S. Phillips, the home captain, and there was some lively scoring. Stratton, however, was given out lbw to a high ball from Captain Christian after making 19. F. Rees was run out after contributing 5, and then matters settled down a little, but the home county made no stand of consequence. Gordon Phillips opened and closed his account with a cut to the boundary. E. S. Phillips was let off at mid-on. Instead of the wicket improving as time went on, it became more difficult. Under the circumstances, Monmouthshire did well to compile 132 in the first innings.

The Devon batting began at 3.15. Ruine came slowly. Monmouthshire's fielding was good. Some of the work of W. A. Williams was excellent, and Diver was very successful as wicket-keeper. Devon was disposed of in the first innings for 119, leaving the advantage with the home county up to that point by 13 runs. But Monmouthshire's second innings opened in most disastrous fashion. In little more than half an hour seven wickets fell for 25 runs, Lieutenant Boles taking six for 15. Score:—

TO-DAY'S CRICKET.

MONMOUTHSHIRE v. DEVON.

This two-day's fixture in the contest for the Minor Counties Championship was commenced at Newport to-day. The outlook in the early part of the morning was most unpromising, rain falling incessantly. Later on, however, the rain ceased, and was succeeded by brilliant sunshine.

The start was advertised for 11.30, and shortly after that hour E. S. Phillips, the Monmouthshire captain, who won the toss, sent in Silverlock and M. Stratton, to the bowling of Captain Christian and Lieut. Boles. The wicket was very soft and played slow.

With only eight runs on the board Silverlock was smartly taken in the slips. Lieut. E. Phillips, who followed in, assisted Stratton to take the score to 23, before the latter put his leg in front of a straight one from Captain Christian. Frank Rees was run out after making five, and Monmouthshire had lost three good wickets for 33 runs.

With E. S. Phillips and Diver together, however, runs came more freely. Diver eventually left at 61, while seven runs later E. S. Phillips was stumped, and F. G. Phillips, who opened with a four off the first ball, was caught and bowled by Lieut. Boles in the same over. W. E. C. Hudden was out at 72, and at the luncheon interval the score stood at 83 for seven wickets.

After lunch Robathan and Watkins made a good stand, adding 33 runs before Watkins was caught. Robathan left soon afterwards for the top score of the side, and the innings soon concluded for 132.

The light was bad, and Devon started their innings with C. J. L. Hooman and Lieut. Boles, who played carefully against the bowling of Gordon Phillips and Silverlock. Runs came very slowly, and when the total had reached 32, Hooman was easily caught from a skier.

With Light in runs came freely, but when the total was 54 Light was cleverly run out between E. S. Phillips and Williams. Roche further enlivened matters, but foolishly ran Boles out when he looked so well set. Further successes fell to Monmouthshire, and six wickets were down for 82 runs.

Afterwards, in spite of a good stand by Sturt, the visitors found run-getting a difficult matter. Diver performing brilliantly behind the wickets—the accounted for no fewer than five batsmen—the innings closed for 119, giving Monmouthshire a lead on the first innings, amidst some excitement, by 13 runs.
