Durham v. Northumberland at Chester-le-Street.

BEWICK'S SURPRISING BOWLING.

A copious fall of rain on Sunday at Chester-le-Street was followed after midnight until the early hours of the morning with a steady downpour. Notwithstanding this, the ground of the Chester-le-Street Club dried under the influence of a chilly north-east breeze sufficiently to allow a beginning of play in the return engagement of Northumberland and Durham at the hour arranged. Dull and cold in the morning, the weather was unpropitious to cricket the whole of the time a most interesting and keenly fought day's play was in progress, and though wonderfully good considering the rather dreary conditions, the patronage accorded the most popular match of the season in the county was below that of last season.

Gaining first possession of the wicket, the Durselmians, going in at twenty-five minutes to twelve, stayed in until ten minutes to three, the innings lasting actually two hours and a half and producing 150 runs. A poor commencement was made when J. Bucknell was dismissed at 9, and A. Oliver, a Consett player who was making his debut for the county, at 16, both wickets falling to the bowling of George Milne. C. Brooks and A. L. Scott-Owen made a promising stand for the third wicket, but going on at 51 in place of Elsey, Ord Richardson, with leg breaks, against which the batsmen never appeared comfortable, met with surprising success. At 60 Brooks was dismissed by a catch at leg off Richardson's bowling, and at 74 Scott-Owen had his wicket shattered with a break ball that completely beat him, the batsman making no stroke at all. Then at 82 T. Coulson fell to a smart catch at leg by Elsey off the bowling of Richardson, who had now captured three wickets at a cost of 13 runs. In an hour and twenty minutes Durham had lost five wickets for 82 runs. The Northumbrians met with no further success before the interval for luncheon. E. B. Proud and J. Bewick having then advanced the score to 126, but afterwards Milne bowled with remarkable success, and capturing four of the remaining five wickets for 6 runs, the Durham innings finished off quickly for 150 runs.

The Northumbrians made a most disastrous opening to their innings, which began just after three o'clock, and though a fine third-wicket partnership by Richardson and Carr held out hopes of a score being realised surpassing that of the Durselmians, a surprising bowling performance by Jas. Bewick, who had all the batsmen in sore trouble, was the chief cause of the venture finishing in two hours and ten minutes for a total falling 27 behind that of the home county's. S. Anderson was out without a run having been scored, Coulson running from square leg to mid on and taking a smart catch off the bowling of Morris, and at 14 C. F. Stanger-Leathes was bowled by the Sunderland professional. Richardson, in upon the fall of the first wicket, and uncomfortable in his opening play against the bowling of Morris, was now joined by Carr, the stand of the innings being made. Richardson quickly settled down to one of the best batting displays he has ever given for the county, and he had made 50 out of 68 in just over an hour before he was third out, leg before wicket, to Thackeray. In Richardson's score there were seven 4's, three 3's, and two 2's, many of his best strokes being pretty placings to leg. Carr was then joined by F. W. Gillespie, who was unfortunately badly struck on the hand twice from Morris' bowling, which was occasionally getting up dangerously off the wicket. Slowly the score was raised to 81, when Bewick, a bowler who has met with no very noteworthy success for his club this season, displaced Thackeray in the attack, and brought about a really startling change in the run of the game.

From the first delivery of Bewick, Carr was out to a bad stroke in the slips to Thackeray, and after Milne had been bowled by a "yorker" from Morris at 81, Gillespie, two runs later, also fell to an easy catch by Thackeray off Bewick's bowling. At 97 N. R. E. Wilkinson gave an accepted chance in the long field to Oliver off Bewick, and C. M. Skinner, who shaped most promisingly, and, with R. Foster, looked like making a good fight to gain the lead on the first innings, was clean bowled by the Chester-le-Street player at 112. Four runs later T. Ullathorne was the ninth out to an easy catch by Thackeray off Bewick's bowling, and the end came when Foster, who played much more carefully than usual, also fell a victim to Bewick, who accomplished by far his finest performance in county cricket in capturing six wickets for 16 runs, a success, it need scarcely be recorded, proving most popular on the Chester-le-Street ground.

Going in a second time, and holding a lead of 27—a useful advantage on a wicket now much out of play—Durham lost three wickets for 56 runs, and they will thus resume play this morning 83 runs ahead with seven wickets to fall. Score:—

MINOR COUNTIES.

Durham Beat Northumberland by 107 Runs.

MORRIS IN DEADLY FORM.

At Chester-le-Street yesterday, the Northumbrians' County eleven, the easy victors over Durham in Whit-Week as judged by the substantial margin of ten wickets, suffered reverse from the Durselmians by 107 runs. On a ground well described by rapid, keen students of cricket predicted that the wicket on which Durham had first innings on Monday morning would unmistakably grow worse every hour during the progress of the game, and that the Durselmians were undoubtedly gaining a tremendous advantage in winning the toss and deciding to go in first.

On Monday Durham had been dismissed for 150 runs, and securing a useful lead of 27 when disposing of the Northumbrians for 123, they scored 56 for the fall of three wickets before play closed for the day. Resuming their innings yesterday morning to the bowling of C. M. Skinner and Milne, they fared none too happily for a while against the deliveries of the St. George's amateur, who at 62, 82, and 88, brought about the dismissal of three good men in J. Bewick, J. Bucknell, and T. Coulson. At 107, Milne captured Lowings' wicket, and at 113 and 123 Morris and E. B. Proud were also dismissed. Proud, in at the fall of the fifth wicket at 82, having played very good cricket for 35. Nine wickets being down against bowling that needed very careful watching, the innings seemed as good as over, but one of those unexpected stands that are ever occurring in the uncertain game of cricket came with a last wicket partnership by Thackeray and I. Robinson, who were not separated until a bowling change was made, Elsey coming on and effecting the dismissal quickly of Thackeray with Durham's score at 159, a total giving the home county the formidable lead on a tricky wicket of 186 runs.

Northumberland commenced their second innings at twenty-five minutes to one, and that their task of making 187 runs was really an impossible one was soon apparent when S. Anderson was bowled by the fourth ball in the first over sent down by Morris. C. F. Stanger-Leathes by the first ball in the second over from the same bowler, and Richardson by the second ball of the next over, three wickets being down for 11 runs. From now the batting showed improvement, but against the deliveries of Morris, which on a dried and treacherous wicket rose from the pitch very quickly and in unplayable manner, the Northumbrians never gave any promise of making a good score. At 25, Carr was out to the fifth ball of Morris' fourth over. The Sunderland professional, with the last ball of his seventh over, sent Milne off stump flying out of the ground the Beagwell Hill pro., like Carr, having just struggled into double figures. The score was then 44, and five runs later F. W. Gillespie, who had batted very steadily for 16, several times getting the ball nicely away to leg, was caught by Bewick at mid-on off Morris, and with six wickets down for

49 the adjournment was made for luncheon, Morris then having taken all six wickets for 34 runs.

Afterwards Morris clean bowled N. R. E. Wilkinson at 60, and R. Foster two balls later at the same score. Then at 69, Bewick clean bowled T. Ullathorne and spoiled Morris of the feat he seemed certain to accomplish of capturing all ten wickets, the end coming at 79, when Morris also clean bowled C. M. Skinner, who had played skilfully and carefully for 16 runs. Though Morris can never desire a wicket better to his liking than that on which he bowled to Northumberland in their second innings, he must still be accorded full praise for his performance of taking nine wickets for 51 runs.

The bright and genial weather which prevailed was in striking contrast to the chilly conditions of the previous day, and the concluding stages of play were witnessed by a fairly good crowd, though the receipts for the two days will fall far short of those of last year. Score:—
