DURHAM WELL AHEAD.

Unpromising Outlook for Cheshire at Darlington.

FINE BATTING BY GORE.

Cheshire's opportunity of obtaining consolation for their defeat at Jeopardy, at the expense of Durham, was blighted in the early stages of the match at Darlington yesterday, and, as the day advanced, the position assumed an absolutely hopeless aspect for the Cheshires. Failing badly in their first innings, Cheshire fielded for the whole of the afternoon, while the Durham batsmen were engaged in the delectable task of compiling a total the like of which they have not known for many years, and at the end of the day the visitors were 370 behind on the first innings. Cheshire probably had the worst of the wicket, which improved later, for Turnbull, who accomplished quite a remarkable bowling feat, got a lot of spin on the ball, and except in the early stages of Durham's first venture, the Cheshire bowling was comparatively poor. Their fielding hardly retrieved the situation, for Durham's most prolific batsman all had "lives"—and prospered subsequently.

Cheshire opened moderately enough, and for a while went from bad to worse, half the side being out in less than half an hour for 27 runs. The sixth-wicket partnership of Rigby and Stockton, who added 26 in just over twenty minutes, tended towards improvement, but after the departure of Stockton, Jones was the only batsman who faced the attack with any degree of confidence. The whole side were, however, out in an hour and a half for 87, and Turnbull, who has this season been figuring in Lancashire cricket, came out with fine figures, taking six wickets at a cost of four runs each. Morris, who was punished by Eaton early on—the Cheshire batsman made his 18 in five hits, practically all off the Sunderland bowler—improved as the innings advanced, and took the last two wickets in three balls.

Durham had ten minutes' batting before lunch, and during that time lost A. E. Walker, who commenced the innings with Turnbull, and who had obtained six out of 10. The Darlington amateur was never comfortable, and when, after Turnbull had been neatly taken at deep point by Osborne, J. M. Russell and C. Brocks left at short intervals, the Cheshire bowlers had to some extent redeemed the moderate batting of the side.

THE TURNING POINT.

Then came a valuable partnership between E. B. Proud and T. A. Bradford, which changed the whole aspect of the game. The Chester-le-Street captain opened warily, and Proud, who played with the greater dash, had a stroke of luck at 18, when, in attempting to cut Buxton, he gave an easy chance low down in the slips to Eaton, which the latter failed to hold. The mistake was an expensive one, for the pair were together when the Cheshire score was unwell, and the pace improved when the century was completed in an hour and twenty-five minutes. Dixon, who had commenced the attack with Turner, returned in place of Buxton just before the century was reached, and after Proud had completed his 50 in fifty-five minutes, Stockton went on at the pavilion end for Turner. The change was effective, for in his second over Stockton sent back Proud with an admirably judged ball. The partnership between Proud and Bradford lasted sixty-two minutes, and produced 86 runs. Proud played a sparkling innings, marked by the one chance in the slips at 19. He scored at a fair pace throughout, cutting and driving in polished style, and invariably punished anything in the shape of loose deliveries. Bradford, who had been content to gradually play himself in, also exercised a nice discrimination, but at 40 offered a rather difficult chance to point. He completed his 50 in seventy minutes, hitting Buxton merrily twice to the leg boundary.

THACKERAY'S UNLUCKY DISMISSAL.

At 182 there was a double change in the bowling, Turner going on for Buxton at the pavilion end, Stockton being replaced by Jones. Bradford immediately hit Jones into the football field for 6, and was developing on quite Jeopardian lines when the second century was completed in two hours and a quarter. At 80 Bradford gave neither chance to Turner at square leg off Voss, who had gone on for Jones, but was clean bowled by Turner nine runs later. He hit a 6 and fourteen 4's, and was at the wickets an hour and forty minutes. The departure of the Chester-le-Street hitter, however, was merely the beginning of the troubles of Cheshire. G. P. Gore, who had helped Bradford to add 92 for the sixth wicket, had played himself well in, and was the outstanding figure in the later stages. Morris departed early, but the captain, T. Coulson, assisted the Featherstone batsman to put on 61 for the eighth wicket. The sixth-wicket partnership provided the liveliest cricket of the day. Thackeray of Middlesbrough hitting up 50 out of 81 in half an hour. He played with characteristic dash, and was unluckily dismissed. He had started to run when Gore hit out, but the drive went straight for Thackeray's wicket. Before the footballing cricketer could recover, Eaton uprooted one of his stumps.

The light, never too good, gradually became worse, and shortly after six o'clock there was an adjournment to the pavilion after an appeal to the umpire. During the wait Durham declared, and matters were drawn a quarter of an hour before time. Gore, amid family surroundings, played a brilliant innings, scoring his 141 in two hours and ten minutes, and hitting twenty 4's, three 3's, and sixteen 2's. A chance at mid-off at 124 was the only blemish in an innings in which powerful driving and admirable placing were the features. Durham were batting exactly four

hours, and the rate of scoring in the later stages was an impressive improvement on the earlier batting. Score and analysis:—

DURHAM VICTORIOUS.

Cheshire Defeated by an Innings and 166 Runs.

FINE BOWLING BY MORRIS.

Though making a praiseworthy effort, and improving visibly upon their poor batting of Wednesday, Cheshire never looked like saving the game against Durham at Darlington yesterday, and within three-quarters of an hour of the resumption after lunch the Donalshians gained a hollow victory by an innings and 166 runs. Cheshire's second venture occupied just over three hours, and up to lunch they had a fair prospect of prolonging the fight, but the Sunderland fast bowler, Morris, was in rare form afterwards on a wicket which suited his pace, and the always faint hope of the Cheshires quickly vanished.

In the stages up to the luncheon interval, chief interest centred in a useful partnership by Voss and Jones. Eaton contributed 20 to the 39 which the first wicket produced, and after Osborne had been quickly dismissed by Parkin, Fallows played steadily, if slowly, until he was amply taken behind the wicket by Gore off Parkin. With Jones and Voss partners, a stubborn resistance was offered to the Durham attack until a clever delivery from Morris beat Voss, who had obtained 37 out of 61 in fifty minutes. At lunch the score was 169 for four wickets.

Rigby was never comfortably and was even more unsettled after the interval, when Morris bowled in rare style. At one stage the Wearside had taken the wickets of Turner, Buxton, and Brewer for three runs, and though Jones once cut him through the slips for 4, Morris finished the innings soon afterwards, Dixon having played on. After the interval Morris had five wickets for seven runs, and his record for the innings was six wickets for 37—a striking tribute to his admirable work. Going in at the fall of the fourth wicket, Jones displayed fine defence, and, although giving a hard chance to Turnbull, he batted throughout with polish and discrimination, and was unbroken at the finish after being at the wicket for over two hours.
