

SOMERSET v. SURREY.

Played at Taunton on August 9, 10 and 11.

LEWIS' BENEFIT.

Somerset won by three wickets.

Surrey took the field without Hayes, who was playing for England, and in his absence included Thompson, the head of the ground-staff, who had not assisted the side for thirteen years, and who has recently developed the art of "googlie" bowling. There was a beautiful wicket and the weather was perfect. Lewis dismissed Hobbs at 26 and Hayward at 29, whilst Goaty left at 31 and Bird at 36. Then Marshal and Ducat came together and in 55 minutes put on 106 for the fifth wicket. Marshal, cutting well, reached 51 in 40 minutes, and made his 75 in 65 minutes: he hit ten 4's. The innings lasted two hours and a-half and realised 187, Lewis taking six wickets for 62. Somerset lost Herbert, Johnson and Robson for 44, and, although Samson and Braund added 38 in 40 minutes, half the side were out for 82: Palaret played-on to the first ball he received. When play ceased six wickets were down for 131. On the second day Daniell and Phillips remained until their stand for the seventh wicket had put on 59 in 50 minutes. The latter hit four 4's off Hitch in an over, and Daniell carried out his bat for 40 when the innings closed for 156. Lees took seven wickets for 42 and obtained his 100th wicket of the season. In Surrey's second innings Hayward played a great game, but, although Goaty helped to put on 25 and Marshal 41, half the side were out for 98. With his total 57 Hayward obtained his 1,000th run of the season. The other players gave him poor support, and when the innings closed for 156 he was left to carry out his bat for a splendid effort of 90. He hit nine 4's and made several fine cuts and drives. Owing to an injury to his leg, Leveson-Gower was unable to bat. Somerset were left with 158 to win and by the end of the day had scored 87 of the number for four wickets. Johnson, Herbert and Samson were out for 14, but Phillips, driving with great power, made 55 out of 82 in 50 minutes and was still not out when stumps were drawn. On Wednesday Phillips was bowled with only 3 added, and at 107 Braund met a similar fate. Robson and Lewis, however, added 31, and the latter and Palaret obtained the other runs necessary, Somerset winning with three wickets to spare. Lewis finished the match by hitting Hitch for three 4's off consecutive balls. Score and analysis:—

OBITUARY.

MR. A. G. GUILLEMARD.

Mr. Arthur George Guillemard, an old Rugbeian, died at Eltham on Saturday in his sixty-fourth year. He will be best remembered as co-founder (in 1862) with the late Mr. Arthur Wilson, of Derby, of the Butterflies, of which he was for many years the honorary secretary. As a player he did not gain fame, but he was a great lover of the game and in 1894 published *Rugby School Cricket Scores, 1831-1893*, under the auspices of the Old Rugbeian Society. When travelling in Australia in 1876 he saw in a Sydney publication the score of the match supposed to have been played during 1874-5 between Ulster and Macquarie, wherein the former were stated to have made 1,238 in an innings, and, not knowing it was a hoax, caused it to be inserted in Lillywhite's *Cricketers' Companion* for 1877. Mr. Guillemard was very well known in the Rugby football world.

MR. C. A. STEIN.

Mr. Charles Albert Stein died suddenly at Croydon on Monday in his fifty-ninth year

after a long period of ill-health. He was born at Tulse Hill and had been a frequenter of the Oval for half-a-century. His connection with the Surrey County C.C. dated back to 1879, and he had served on the committee without a break since 1882. As a small boy he received hints from Griffith, Caffyn, Cæsar, Mortlock and others, and in later years took part in a lot of club cricket, especially for Surrey Club and Ground and the Burlington Wanderers. During Mr. Alcock's serious illness six years ago he undertook the secretarial duties in an honorary capacity. A Chat with him was published in *Cricket* of August 20th, 1903.

MR. R. MONCREIFFE.

The death is announced at Durban, South Africa, on Friday last of Mr. Ronald

Moncreiffe, fourth son of the late Sir T. Moncreiffe, Bart., in his forty-fifth year. He was in the Harrow Eleven in 1881 and 1882, being contemporary with E. M. Hadow and H. T. Hewett. In the former year he made a pair of spectacles against Eton, but in the latter scored 4 and 44. He has been described as "A capital bat with a stubborn defence, and good cutting powers: a fast-medium bowler with a good length, and a fair field." In 1899-1900 he served in the Boer War as Captain in the Worcestershire Yeomanry, and was besieged in Mafeking. He was born in 1864.

Taking first innings, the visitors opened badly, Howell being bowled by Boles before he had scored, and the second wicket falling with the total only 7. J. Rees and Conway Rees made some sort of a stand, but after the side collapsed badly, the innings closing for 31. Wilson, who had replaced Boles, bowled with conspicuous success, his analysis at one time reading: Four over, four wickets, no runs. Altogether he took five wickets for 8 runs.

Devonshire started none too well, but when Hooman came in the complexion of things was completely changed. He batted superbly for his 135, only giving one very doubtful chance when 120, and his figures included two 6's and sixteen 4's. DEVON v. CARMARTHEN. GOOD BATTING BY HOOMAN.

These counties opposed each other in the Minor Counties competition at Torquay yesterday in glorious weather, and before a good attendance. The visitors winning the toss elected to bat, and sent H. Howell and L. Evans to face the defenses of Aston and D. C. Boles. The first was dismissed, on three maidens were sent down in succession, and with the last ball of his second over, Boles shot down Howell's leg stump for a "duck," the first wicket falling for 7 runs. With the score unaltered, Aston bowled Evans for 3. Percy Rees and Conway Rees then became associated, and made what turned out to be the stand of the innings, putting on between them 59 runs. Aston then bowled Percy Rees for 15. At this juncture Wilson relieved Boles at the bowers' wicket, and achieved a remarkable feat, capturing five wickets for six runs only in seven overs, four of which were maidens. However, he got into double figures, but the rest offered little or no resistance, the last wicket falling with the total at 73. Wilson's bowling naturally dented the rest of the Devon bowlers, but Aston and Boles each took two wickets for 32 and 20 runs respectively. The Devon fielding was exceptionally smart throughout the innings, Davies, in particular, being especially good behind the stumps.

Devon started their innings in none too promising a form, three good wickets, those of Lieut. Wilson and Harrison and Light, falling for 41. C. V. L. Hooman then gave a magnificent display of batting. Taking no liberties with the bowling at the commencement of his innings, he carefully placed himself in, and, on becoming set, commenced to give the spectators a display of his form at the top of his style. All the bowling seemed to come alike to him, and he scored at an exceptionally fast rate. He reached his 100 after a little over an hour's play, and gave no chance until he was 120, when he was badly injured from a hot chance at mid-off. He was eventually lb.w. to Howell, after compiling 150, which included two 6's, sixteen 4's, five 3's, and ten 2's. His was mostly observed at the close of his great innings. After his departure the score was augmented by J. F. Orchard (31), Capt. Waller (31), J. F. Shelley (16), and L. Tamworth (10). The innings closed for 257, leaving Devon with the useful lead of 184 runs. Going in against this total for the second time, Carmarthen made a deplorable start, losing four valuable wickets for the paltry total of 9 runs, which seems to indicate that Devon will have matters their own way when the match is resumed this morning. DEVON'S BIG LEAD.

BRILLIANT BATTING DISPLAY AGAINST CARMARTHEN.

CENTURY BY C. V. L. HOOMAN.

Devon seem in a fair way to win this match on the Torquay ground, Carmarthen at the end of play last evening being in an almost hopeless position. The feature of the day's play was a brilliant innings for 135 by C. V. L. Hooman. The Oxford man was perfectly at home on the pitch, and he gave a splendid exhibition. He hit all around the wicket, and did not give any semblance of a chance until reaching 120, when he gave C. Morgan a very difficult opportunity. He hit two 6's and sixteen 4's, and his batting was at times extremely interesting. Light, Wilson also accomplished a fine total, each taking five wickets for 6 runs only.

Brisk weather prevailed for the fixture, but there was a poor attendance at the commencement. The visitors made one change from the team that faced so disastrously against Cornwall, Hugh Howell coming in vice Lewis. The Welsh captain won the toss, and H. Howell and H. Evans started on a good wicket against the bowling of Aston and D. O. Boles. Matters opened very quietly, three maiden overs being sent down before either batsman had opened his account. Then off Boles, Evans obtained a couple through the slips, afterwards getting another, but with the last ball of the over Boles bowled Howell for a "blub." This success was soon followed by another, as with the second ball of his next over Aston completely beat Evans, his leg stump being uprooted, P. Rees and J. C. Rees were now associated, and although the latter made four nice hits, matters were very quiet. The Devon bowlers were always doing well, and only 18 runs were scored in the first half an hour. At 20, Light went on at Aston's end, and at 27 Aston changed over to the other end, while Boles at once took the ball from Light. The batsmen continued to find runs very difficult to obtain, but the score was taken to 37 when Aston bowled P. Rees, play having been in progress about an hour.

At 48, Lieut. Wilson went on for Boles and the change was immediately beneficial, as with the last ball of his first over he got Geo caught by Light at mid-off. The 50 went up after an hour and a half's play, and then Boles caught Gwynny Irees, who had contributed a capital 30. Wilson got a third wicket in his next over, Aston catching Cyril Morgan in the slips. Wilson had bowled fourteen balls and had taken his three wickets without a run being scored off him, Capt. Morgan came in, but Davies smartly stumped him before he had opened his account—four wickets to Wilson for no runs. The Navy man was doing finely, and at 57 he clean bowled H. Rees, the eighth wicket being down. Just before lunch Capt. Waller went on in the place of Aston, who had had a long spell of bowling, and when the teams retired the score was 72 for eight wickets.

Light started at the bottom end on the resumption, and John at his last ball survived a confident appeal for a lbw. Boles went on at the top end. About ten minutes from the restart Light bowled John at 72, the bunch score having been added to. In the next over Bevan was caught by Light off Boles, and the innings closed for 73.

Lieut. Wilson and Harrison opened the Devon innings, facing the bowling of Howell and Bevan. Wilson took first blood, and both started hitting. At 17 Geo went on for Bevan. At 19 Howell crept and bowled Harrison, the latter having contributed 6. Two runs later Geo completely beat Wilson, and two wickets were down for 21. C. V. L. Hooman was now partnered with Light, and the pair quickly played themselves in. When they appeared to be set, however, Evans caught Light beautifully off Howell at extra cover, the score being 31. Hooman, associated with J. F. Shelley continued to hit freely, and when the half-century went up he had had 20 of them. At 30 Shelley was badly missed by Bevan at deep cover, but 2 runs later John covered the error by taking him in the slips. Shelley and Hooman had put on 41 for the fourth wicket, the former having contributed 16. In the same over Geo caught and bowled D. C. Boles with the total unaltered.

J. F. Orchard came in and he and Hooman played very steadily. At 118 Captain Morgan came on for Geo, and at the other end C. Morgan replaced Howell. Hooman did well subsequently, and six of his hits were consecutively 4, 4, 4, 6, 4, and 4. He knocked 18 off Captain Morgan in one over. The batsman continued to hit out strongly all round the wicket, but at length he was put leg before wicket by Howell. He had scored 135 out of 214 in just under two hours. Orchard and he had put on 153 for the sixth wicket, and the extent to which Hooman had monopolised the bowling may be judged by the fact that he had made nearly 130 in this interval.

In the same over Howell bowled Davis for a "blub." At 216 Geo bowled Orchard with a beautiful ball, the latter having made 30. Captain Waller, who followed, hit briskly, but at 231 spooned a ball into Davies's hands. The wicket keeper unaccountably failed to hold the leather. With the next ball, however, Geo clean bowled him for 51. At 267 Howell with a left-handed catch off Waller completed the innings. The visitors started a second time, but Hooman caught Davies at short square leg off Boles at 5, and with the total unchanged Aston bowled Captain Hughes-Morgan, who then had a "pair" nearest his name, Geo, the new-comer, was dismissed with Aston's next ball, Hooman catching him smartly at short slip. Shortly after Davies got J. C. Rees out with the rebound from his pads. H. Howell and P. Rees played out time.

The batsmen hit a few, but at 37 Wilson took the ball from Boles, and the change was immediately beneficial, the Navy man bowling Howell with his third delivery. Howell had made 21 by steady, reliable cricket. Lie Evans succeeded him, and at 41 Light went on at the top end vice Aston.
