YORKSHIRE SECOND ELEVEN v. NOTTS
SECOND ELEVEN.

THE YORKSHIREMEN'S FIRST DEFEAT.

In being beaten to the extent of ten wickets in their match with the Notts Second Eleven at Trent Bridge yesterday, the Yorkshire Second Eleven sustained their first reverse of the season. It is true that the Yorkshiremen missed the absence of their two hard-wicket bowlers, Broadbent and Brown, who were required at Sheffield, but their downfall was primarily due to their failure with the bat. That was all the more strange seeing that the side on the face of it was strong in batsmen, and that the wicket throughout was fast and entirely suited to good scoring. The team were out much too cheaply in being dismissed for 125 in their first innings, and inasmuch as Notts secured a lead of 98 runs, the defeat of the visitors may be said to have been encompassed by the first day's play. The chief honours of the match on the Yorkshire side were carried off by Drake, the Harrogate professional, who, though played essentially as a bowler, showed his versatility by recording the highest score on Monday, and by making a useful stand when Yorkshire were being hard pressed in the second innings.

The visitors at one time looked in danger of suffering an innings defeat, but they did not give in without a struggle. They resumed yesterday morning with all their wickets intact and a deficit to face of 83 runs. Grimshaw and Hardisty, the overnight batsmen, however, had only been together a quarter of an hour and reduced the deficit to 75, when the Leeds man, to whom ill-luck clings persistently, played on to his wicket for 10. Turner, along with Grimshaw, batted with exceeding care, and scoring proceeded so slowly that only 15 runs had been added in the first hour's play. Turner was at the wickets half-an-hour for three, when he was smartly taken in the slips by Armstrong, and Richardson, who succeeded, only added two, when he had to retire to an appeal for l b w, by Clifton. Smith, the Ilkley youth, opened nervously, and was lucky in being given a "life" by Armstrong in the slips in his first over. He batted steadily enough afterwards, and the form he showed in scoring 19 was sufficient to merit his being given another trial.

He was sixth man out at 81, his dismissal following closely upon that of Grimshaw, who had held the fort with courage and grim patience for nearly two hours. The catch which he gave to the Rev. H. Staunton at mid-off when his contribution stood at 36 was the only bad stroke he made. Booth got his legs in front of the wickets in the first over bowled by Lee, and with all the best batsmen gone Yorkshire's position seemed hopeless when Mr. Tattersall and Drake came together for the seventh wicket. The Harrogate contingent batted more freely than any of their predecessors had done, and had added 40 runs in as many minutes when Drake was out to a hard catch returned to Barnes, making seven wickets down for 121. Mr. Tattersall, who had batted brightly for 25, was out in the next over to a splendid catch by Iremonger in the slips. A spirited stand by Mr. Whitaker and Dolphin followed, but when the Leeds Springfield amateur fell a victim to Armstrong at 103, after making 22, there was no further hope for Yorkshire, who were all out for 167.

Notts were left with 70 runs to get to win, and though five bowlers were tried, Mr. Cursbam and James successfully defied the attack and rubbed off the runs in fifty minutes without being separated. They were fortunate in so doing, for in Richardson's second over, James was twice missed—once by Drake in the slips, and on the second occasion by Smith at mid-on. After those escapes, James batted in perfect style, and in his not out score of 50 he had 3 fours and 4 threes. Full score and analysis:—

**YORKSHIRE SECOND ELEVEN v. NOTTS.
SECOND ELEVEN.**

HOME COUNTY'S USEFUL LEAD.

In a full day's cricket at Trent Bridge yesterday the Notts Second Eleven obtained a useful lead over a rather unrepresentative Yorkshire Second Eleven, the bowling strength of which had been to some extent depleted by the calling up of Broadbent and Brown for county duty at Sheffield. Drake, of Harrogate, and Hartington, of Featherstone, chiefly maintained the attack in their absence, but though both bowled fairly well, they could not prevent the home county taking a lead of 98 runs on the first innings. Yorkshire reduced that deficit to 83 on their second venture without losing a wicket.

The most satisfactory circumstance about Yorkshire's first innings was the improvement effected by Drake when things were going very badly with the team. The Harrogate professional went in when five wickets were down for 40, and marked his return to county cricket by scoring 34 runs. His batting was not faultless, and there were times in the early part of his innings when he was sadly bothered by the bowling. Having survived the first couple of overs, however, he settled down to steady batting, and did not retire until he had assisted to carry the score to 121 for the eighth wicket. With his dismissal all was practically over, the innings closing after two hours and ten minutes' batting for 125.

Such a score for the Yorkshire Second team on a perfect wicket was disappointing. That the innings did not prove more productive was due to the failure of the earlier batsmen, Grimshaw, Turner, Richardson, and Smith—the last-named a batsman from Ilkley who was having his first trial with the Yorkshire side—were all out for 24. Hardisty and Booth made a stand which doubled the score, and all might have been well with the side if the Leeds man had not been tempted by an off-stroke, which he snicked into the safe hands of Armstrong at second slip. The association of Armstrong and Iremonger, by-the-way, was peculiarly effective, for the former caught four batsmen off the latter's bowling. Mr. S. J. Whitaker, of the Leeds Springfield Club, was the not out batsman, and in scoring 23 he practised to good purpose an effective "pull" stroke.

The Notts Eleven in their reply managed to get a lead of 98 runs in their three hours' batting. The chief contribution to their total of 223 was a beautifully played innings of 90 by James, who, on his yesterday's form, would appear to merit re-inclusion in the Notts County Eleven proper. It may be that much of the bowling tried against him was of a very indifferent kind. He had a narrow shave early on in putting up a fast ball from Hartington dangerously near to Drake, but the fieldsman could hardly get his hand to it, and thereafter the batsman never made a faulty stroke. After having got the measure of the bowling, he was particularly punishing with his own drive, though he scored freely all round the wicket. He scored his first fifty in just over an hour, and had been at six wickets an hour and fifty minutes when he was completely deceived by the first ball he received from Grimshaw—a slow break from the "off," which took his leg stump. James who was fourth man out at 144, hit 6 fours, 10 threes, and 6 twos. With his dismissal, the wickets of the Rev. H. Staunton, Stapleton, and Lee fell for the addition of only 19 runs, but a useful stand by Mr. J. K. Lane (32), was chiefly instrumental in enabling the Notts eleven to reach 223 for their all-out score. Mr. Lane was ninth man out to a fine catch by Richardson at mid-off the best of the day. The brunt of the attack was borne by Hartington, the Featherstone bowler, whose four wickets had, however, cost him 71 runs. In the quarter of an hour remaining for play, Grimshaw and Hardisty put on 15 for no wicket. Present score and analysis:

MINOR COUNTIES CRICKET.

NOTTS. II. v. YORKSHIRE II.

HOME SIDE'S BIG LEAD.

Entering at Trent Bridge yesterday upon their first match in the Minor Counties Championship, the Notts. Second Eleven, with Yorkshire II. as opponents, are to be congratulated upon a splendid send off. Upon the first innings they put the White Rose representatives completely in the shade, and throughout the team the batmanship was of a very high order. Yorkshire, who had the first use of a typical Trent Bridge wicket, made poor use of it, and Drake, with 34, was the highest scorer. His was a capital innings, and good form was also revealed by Hardisty, whose 28 was accomplished by attractive cricket. The venture only realised 125, which Notts. passed for the least of four wickets. The exhibition of the home-side was dominated by the fine innings of James, whose 90 was a splendid effort. Occasionally the young professional was slow in scoring, but at other times he quite made up for this by good forcing cricket, and he was specially strong on the on-drive. R. H. T. Turner showed himself a promising stylist, and J. K. Lane, the Southwell amateur, got 32 in really admirable manner, plucking out the right balls to hit and getting them cleanly and hard away. The whole Notts. innings was an obstinate affair, and the partnership for the ninth and tenth wickets, adding 40 and 19 respectively, were among the hardest to break. Hatfield, the fast bowler from Featherstone, was the most successful in attack on the visitors' side, and he was hard worked, his four wickets all being taken in his first spell of bowling.

Interest in the morning's cricket mainly centred in the bowling and fielding of the Notts. eleven, for with the exception of the admirable displays given by Hardisty and Drake there was little of note in the Yorkshire batting. The White Rose made a very bad start by losing Grimshaw, who, with Hatfield, have represented the first eleven on many occasions, with only 1 run scored, and three wickets down for 16 did not promise much success for the visitors. Subsequently, however, the batsmen rallied, and productive partnerships between Hardisty and Booth, and Drake and Whittaker, placed them in a far better position than at first appeared likely to be the case. The scoring when the two last-named were associated was the brightest of the day up to that point. Notts. did well in the field, for Barnes and Clifton bowled excellently, and the ball with which the former dismissed Turner, and the latter sent back Tattersall, were magnificent. At lunch eight wickets were down for 120 runs, and only 5 were added afterwards for the close.

Unlike their opponents, Notts. commenced in good style, for James, after a poor stroke in the slips, settled down to fine and safe cricket, and although Curshaw had a short life, and Turner was slow in starting, the home side speedily established themselves in an advantageous position. Turner's 17 was obtained by some really delightful strokes, and after he left, Iremonger's steadiness was invaluable. James claimed 50 in an hour and ten minutes. At the ten interval the total stood at 80. Subsequently both men played lively cricket, and a number of crisp boundary strokes won applause. Everyone expected to see James get his hundred, but when 10 short he mistimed a ball from Grimshaw, which included six 4's and ten 3's. It was a praiseworthy exhibition to the end, and the partnership between Lane and Armstrong was particularly good, adding 40 in thirty-five minutes, and sending up the second hundred. The last wicket was also stubborn, producing 19, for which Clifton was mainly responsible, and the innings closed after three hours and five minutes, for 225, Notts. thus having the useful lead of 95 on the first innings.

Yorkshire had twenty-five minutes' batting, and scored 15, so that with all their wickets standing they are still 83 in arrears. Score and analysis:

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP.

NOTTS. II. v. YORKSHIRE II.

HOME COUNTY'S TEN WICKETS' VICTORY.

Although the match in the Minor Counties Championship between Notts. II. and Yorkshire II. lasted longer at Trent Bridge yesterday than at one time it appeared likely to do, the home side won in the end by the substantial margin of ten wickets. It was Yorkshire's first defeat of the season in the junior championship, and it was a heavy one. The White Rose representatives were thoroughly outpointed in every department of the game. Yesterday, with one or two notable exceptions, their batting sadly broke down, and it was left to the seventh and ninth batsmen to show the best cricket of the day so far as the Yorkshiremen were concerned. Nothing more tedious than the opening of the visitors' second innings in the morning could be imagined, and although some of the later batsmen atoned in slight measure for the shortcoming of their predecessors, the game never really recovered from the depressing influence of Grimshaw, Turner, and Richardson. On the other hand, C. Curshaw and James, going in to get 70 to win, displayed fine sporting cricket, and although the amateur was missed behind the wicket and the professional in the slips and at mid-on the excellence of their batting was unmistakable. To James in particular should praise be given for an attractive and even polished exhibition.

The Yorkshire batsmen showed complete consciousness of the awkward position in which they were placed, and it was impossible to tempt them into anything approaching freedom of style. Grimshaw had the narrowest of escapes in Barnes' second over, the ball beating the bat but missing the wicket, and thereafter the left-hander maintained the most stubborn of fronts. The nature of his display will be judged when it is said that for three-quarters of an hour he never moved at all. During that period only 11 runs were scored, by Hardisty, who quite misjudged a shooter, and Turner, the latter of whom provided Armstrong with his sixth slip catch during the match. The fieldman very nearly made it seven immediately afterwards, missing Smith off Clifton before the batsman had scored. Naturally, with play so quiet the Notts. bowlers had curious records, and after getting Richardson leg before Clifton had sent down 14 overs for seven maidens, three singles and two wickets. The 50 took no less than an hour and fifty minutes to score, and Grimshaw's 36 occupied him two hours before mid-off closed his inglorious career—the first chance the left-hander had given. The fourth wicket added 36. Prior to lunch Drake and Tattersall gave a much-needed flip to the proceedings, and at the interval the score was 108 for six wickets.

Two productive partnerships, of 49 for the seventh, and 42 for the ninth wickets, helped the total out in the afternoon, and Drake, Tattersall, Whittaker, and Dolphin played really admirably for their runs. Tattersall played exceptionally well on the off-side, and some of his drives were first rate. Eventually the venture closed for 167, leaving Notts. 70 to get to win, a task which they entered upon just before half-past three. They managed to secure the runs without loss, for although both Curshaw and James were missed, the latter off two successive balls at seven, the scoring was fast, and in fifty minutes Notts. had won by ten wickets, the professional with a lovely out to the boundary making the total 69 and Curshaw obtaining the winning single in the next over.
