GLAMORGAN v. CORNWALL.

WISHERMEN LEAD ON FIRST INNINGS.

Brilliant weather favoured the Glamorgan and Cornwall match at Swansea yesterday, and in consequence not only was there a large crowd present, but some excellent cricket was witnessed. Cornwall took first knock on a plumb wicket, and Bickford-Smith and Tressawna were attacked by Creber and Nash. The batsmen played confidently, and at 38 Maxwell bowled vice Nash, and almost immediately the Swansea fast bowler sent Tressawna back. There was another change in the attack, Hacker going on at the other end, and Bickford-Smith was just miswed off him at second slip, though the change was a difficult one. At 75, however, Maxwell succeeded in hitting the Cornishman's off attack out of the ground. Howling brilliantly, the game bowler dismissed Trevarthen for a "duck," and the visitors' chances were looking none too good until Coad and Vibart got together, Rogers having meanwhile been fluently bowled by Hacker. Steadily the score went up, and the century appeared after an hour and forty minutes' play. Creber and Nash now had a turn at bowling, and once Vibart hit the former on to Mumbles-road for 6. At the luncheon hour the score stood at 123, but on resuming play the Cornishmen simply fell to pieces against the attack of Creber and Nash, though Vibart carried out his bat for a splendid 50. Only 41 runs had been added after lunch, and Cornwall's innings closed for 164. Norman Riches and Whittington opened for Glamorgan, and the start was a bad one for the home side, as from the first ball sent down the latter was fluently caught low down at point by Tressawna off Hawken. But croft then partnered Riches, and the pair settled down to the best cricket seen on St. Helen's ground this season. The bowling was frequently changed, but the partnership remained until Coad dismissed it by a good catch of Baneroff off Harvey. Riches was similarly out some minutes later, and then Hawken and Whiting opened Glamorgan's batting.

GLAMORGAN v. CORNWALL.

CORNISHMEN'S HEAVY REVERSE.

Glorious weather was again experienced yesterday when the Glamorgan and Cornwall match was resumed at Swansea before a large crowd. When stumps were drawn overnight the Cornishmen had just managed to despatch the Glamorgan side, whose first innings closed at 306, which gave them a lead of 142 over the visitors' first innings total. Bickford-Smith and Tressawna now opened Cornwall's second innings to the attack of Creber and Nash. Norman Riches kept wicket for the Welshmen, Baneroff having to surrender the gloves in consequence of an injury to his thumb. With the departure of Tressawna wickets fell with such rapidity that Cornwall soon had an innings defeat staring them in the face. Maxwell bowled brilliantly, and at 20 minutes post noon eight wickets were down for 95 runs. Vibart, who for the second time during the match had the distinction of hitting Creber right out on to Mumbles-road for 6, was afterwards tempted out of his ground by the slow bowler, and fell a victim to the sapping powers of Norman Riches. G. Harvey and Major Williams gave no trouble, and after an hour and a half's play Cornwall were all out a second time for 66. Trevarthen abstained from batting owing to illness. Glamorgan thus won by an innings and 47 runs.

BIG LEAD FOR GLAMORGAN

CENTURIES BY BANCROFT AND NORMAN RICHES.

A match between Glamorgan and Cornwall, which completed the fixtures for the Minor Counties' Championship in the Western Division, was opened at Swansea on Wednesday. The weather was hot, and the wickets dry and firm.

Cornwall started the batting, Treawna and Smith opening their innings with considerable success against Maxwell's and Hacker's bowling, and the first wicket fell for 44 runs. Maxwell, however, at length got in some good work, and disposed of both of them. Afterwards Hobes batted in promising style till dismissed by Hacker. The innings subsequently was noteworthy for a very good batting display by W. Coad and Vihart. The latter reached his 50 before the tenth wicket fell, and he carried out his bat, Nash and Creber doing very effective work with the ball during the latter half of the innings. Nash and Maxwell proved the most effective of the four Glamorgan bowlers tried, the former taking four wickets for 40 and the latter three for 37.

Glamorgan started their "reply" just before three o'clock. Norman Hobes and T. A. L. Whittington being the first to appear at the wickets, defending against Hawken and Whiting. Hawken's very first ball was put by the Neath captain into the hands of H. Treawna, the first wicket falling for nothing. This initial check was amply compensated for, however, when Hobes got as partner Bancroft, for they gave the Cornishmen plenty of leather-hunting for the next hour and a half. Both hit out brilliantly at everything that came to them, boundaries coming from either end with great rapidity. Changes in the Cornish bowling (in the persons of H. Treawna and Trevarthen) produced no ill-effects, and later on a spirited competition developed between the two batsmen as to which should first reach his century. The Swansea man, however, scored the more rapidly, and at 4.45, when the Cornish total was passed, he got his 100 amid loud applause. He was out, however, after adding only 9 more runs, being caught at point by Coad off Harvey. S. Rees was not a stayer, but Norman Riches kept at the wicket for some time longer, and at last fell a victim to Whiting, being caught by K. Hawken. Maxwell afterwards hit up 35, but the batting towards the end was poor, and six wickets fell in an hour. Glamorgan had a lead of 142 runs on the first innings. Scores—
