The following letter from Mr. Jos. Gardiner, president of the West Australian Cricket Association, received on Thursday is interesting:—

"When in Ceylon, eighteen months ago, I was much struck with the interest taken in the national game, and I saw some very good cricketers there. If anything, the natives seemed to me to be the better all-round men. I then thought it would be a very good idea, and a very educational one for the West-ralians, if a visit could be arranged. The turf pleases them immensely, and anyone who has partaken of the hospitality of the Island can never forget it. MONMOUTH v. CORNWALL.

CAPITAL EFFORT BY THE CORNISHMEN.

At the close of play in the Minor Counties Championship match at Newport, yesterday, Cornwall held a commanding position, as they were 249 runs on, with eight wickets to fall. This was due chiefly to the collapse of Monmouthshire before the fine bowling of H. Tressawna and E. Hawken. Cornwall batted first, and lost four wickets for 62 runs. Then Dr. Tressawna and Coad made a fine stand, and it was not until the score was 132 that Coad was dismissed. His partner, who had made 76 by fine batting, including some very effective pulls, was out at the same total, and the last five wickets put on only 15 runs. Monmouthshire appeared to have a comparatively easy task, but lost two wickets for 8 runs. Then T. B. Williams and Diver made an excellent stand, but the former went at 59, and the latter at 67. Two other wickets fell at that score, and Monmouthshire were all out for 75 runs, of which two men had made 52. Cornwall had two hours' batting in their second innings, and lost the first wicket at 25. Then H. Tressawna and Dr. Tressawna treated the bowling with scant respect, but when the score was 132 the Cornish captain was bowled for 65, made without a chance. Dr. Tressawna, who again showed great form with the bat, played out time, and when stumps were drawn for the day he was only two short of his first innings' score, without having given a chance, while Rogers was 19 not out. MONMOUTH v. CORNWALL.

When play was resumed at Newport, Cornwall after gaining a lead of 74 on the first innings had scored 175 for two wickets at their second venture. Dr. Tressawna was not out 74, and R. Rogers not out 19. After batting cautiously for a quarter of an hour Rogers was caught by Steer at 183. Silverlock afterwards went on bowling in place of Raikes, and in his first over he clean bowled the doctor, who had made 81. Four wickets were down for 195, and Trevarthen and Coad added 50 for the next wicket, then Coad was easily caught at mid-off. With Vibart as his partner Trevarthen reached his 50, and after lunch carried his score to 63, at which point he was caught in the slips. Vibart batted vigorously, but in attempting to complete his 50 with a boundary hit was caught in the long field by E. S. Phillips. At that point Cornwall had made 301 for seven wickets, and were 455 runs on. The Cornish captain therefore declared, leaving Monmouthshire three hours and a half to bat to make the runs or play out time. This task proved quite beyond their powers. They started fairly well, but from the moment that Silverlock was caught by Bickford-Smith in the slips at 21 it was apparent that they were foredoomed to a heavy reverse, and Cornwall eventually won by 345 runs. Going in against Cornwall's total of 147, the homesters seemed to have an easy task set them, but they failed against the fine attack of Hawken and the visiting skipper, and were all out for 73. Of this total, two men (Williams and Diver) made 52. H. Tresawna had the splendid analysis of four wickets for five runs. TO-DAY'S CRICKET.

MONMOUTHSHIRE v. CORNWALL.

Collapse of Home County.

Following an innings defeat by Glamorgan, the Cornwall team came on to Newport to-day for a two days' match with Monmouthshire in the Minor Counties Championship.

Play was started at 20 minutes to 12, and though the heat was again excessive, there was rather more breeze than yesterday. The team which lost to Glamorgan was strengthened by the inclusion of Dr. Tresawna, who has done splendid service for Abergavenny since he settled in the town; but although they won the toss and went in on a batting wicket, they made a bad start, losing H. Tresawna with only two runs scored. Dr. Tresawna and W. N. Bickford-Smith then became associated, and the doctor promptly set to work.

Only 20 runs had been scored when Bickford-Smith was easily caught off Raikes. Dr. Tresawna and B. Rogers carried the score to 82, when the latter was bowled. The next wicket fell at the same total, but Dr. Tresawna and W. Coad added 70 runs before Coad fell a victim to a good ball from Raikes. Without any addition to the score Dr. Tresawna was caught for a grandly played innings of 78, which included 12 boundaries, and which was free from any actual chance. At the luncheon interval the visitors had lost seven wickets for 141 runs.

Less than five overs after lunch sufficed to bring the Cornwall innings to a close, the visitors being all out at 20 minutes to three for the very moderate total of 147 runs.

When Monmouthshire went in to bat, an uncommonly poor start was made. E. S. Phillips was caught at the wicket after the third ball had been sent and before a run had been scored, and Silverlock was caught in the slips with only five runs on the telegraph. Two wickets were thus drawn for eight runs, but T. B. Williams and Diver made a capital stand.

Just, however, when the pair seemed set for a good partnership, Diver was bowled. T. B. Williams did not long survive him and then came a series of disasters for Monmouthshire, the six remaining batsmen going out for the addition of only 13 runs.

H. Tresawna had four wickets at a cost of five runs, and Hawken captured five wickets for 28 runs.

The whole side was out in about an hour and a quarter for 73 runs, or 74 runs behind.

Cornwall started their second innings at 4.15, in the same order as in the first, and when 25 runs had been scored Bickford-Smith was caught at the wicket.

TO-DAY'S CRICKET.

Play was resumed in this two days' match at Newport to-day in the Minor Counties' Championship. Over night, Cornwall had lost two wickets in their second innings for 175 runs.

Dr. Tresawna and B. Rogers continued their innings to the bowling of F. G. Phillips and Silverlock. Only 13 runs had been added to the total when Rogers was caught off the fast bowler. The score was advanced to 195, when Dr. Tresawna was bowled by Silverlock. He had made 84, and as in the first innings had batted grandly, hitting seven fours, a three, and 15 twos. With Trevarthen and W. Coad together the second century was telegraphed for the loss of four wickets.

Trevarthen and Coad added 50 runs before the latter was out to a catch off Silverlock. Vibart, who succeeded him, helped Trevarthen to put on another 89 runs before the next wicket fell. At the luncheon interval the visitors had scored 334 for the loss of six wickets.

On resuming after luncheon the hitting continued, but when Trevarthen was caught the Cornish captain declared the innings closed at 381 for seven wickets. Trevarthen had made 88 runs, including twelve 4's, and although he scored rather slowly his innings was a sound one.

Monmouthshire were left with 456 to get to win, and with three and a half hours in which to play.

Monmouthshire started on their practically impossible task at five minutes to three with Silverlock and E. S. Phillips. The batsmen at once tried to force the run-getting, but when the total reached 21 Silverlock was caught in the slips, in exactly the same way as in the first innings.

Soon after five o'clock Monmouthshire were all for 110 runs, and Cornwall had thus won by 345 runs.
