**Bedfordshire v. Cambridgeshire.**

Last season—Cambs won on first innings by 7 runs.

Bedfordshire brought their season's fixtures in the Minor Counties' Championship to a close on Monday and Tuesday, when they visited Cambridge for the return fixture. It was also Cambridgeshire's last match, and interest attached to the game by reason of the fact that upon the issue depended which county would finish at the bottom of the group, Cambs having previously gained 15 points and Beds 13½. Beds had the same team that played against Lincolnshire at Skegness, and Cambs were represented by a much stronger side than that which failed so dismally at Wardown in the holiday week, the team differing in only one respect from the eleven which beat Herts on Saturday by an innings and 136 runs.

The match was played on Fenners (University) ground in bright weather, and Monday's play produced some exceedingly bright cricket. The Cambs captain won the toss, but with the wicket on the soft side he hesitated for some time before deciding to bat first. His decision was justified, though the wicket played none too easy. L J Reid and Coulson made a useful first wicket stand, putting on fifty before the former was caught off Peel's bowling. The Beds. fielding was none too smart, and some expensive mistakes were made. Reid gave more than one chance at the wicket before his innings was closed, while Coulson and Ling were also missed. For these mistakes Beds had to suffer dearly, as Coulson hit up 45, and Ling reached the half century, but the most expensive mistake was that which let off C. H. Pigg before he had scored. Profiting by his escape, the Cambs. captain's eldest son put on 50 at a time when runs were badly needed. When lunch time arrived Cambs. had done well in scoring 140 for two wickets, but afterwards a decided change came over the game. Ling and Watts, who were not out 50 and 20 respectively at the interval, were disposed of with the addition of only one run, whilst B W Pigg and F Roberson each had a short stay. Six wickets were down for 155—a very different state of affairs to 142 for two. C H Pigg and F E Collier stopped a dangerous rot, and carried the score to 191, when Orr, who bowled one over to enable Morcom to change to the other end, got Collier caught at mid-off. While the captain and his eldest boy were associated, 30 more were added, and remaining partnerships raised the total to the very respectable number of 251.

The light was very dubious when the Bedfordshire innings was commenced with B L Peel and W E King. Rose, who upset the Herts men on Saturday, bowled very fast, and would early have been credited with a couple of wickets had two chances been accepted. When he had scored three King put one up to C H Pigg in the slips and was missed, while Peel at six received a life at the wicket. The chances, however, were very hard ones, and their non-acceptance led to 71 being put on for the first wicket. After King's dismissal for 25, Wharmby was quickly disposed of, but Holdstock and Peel offered a stubborn resistance, and were undefeated when stumps were pulled up for the day. Beds were in a very rosy position with 131 for two wickets, Peel's share being 84 and the Luton pro's 17.

On Tuesday Beds closed their innings for 302, of which 23 were "extras." Cambridgeshire went to the wicket a second time and were all dismissed for 158. Bedfordshire knocked up the required runs for the loss of four wickets.

CAMBS. v. BEDS.

The return match between these teams in the Minor Counties Championship was commenced on Fenner's, Cambridge, on Monday. Considerable interest was taken in the game as upon the issue depended which shire should finish up at the bottom of the list, Cambs. having scored 15 points, while Beds. had 13½. A full team was brought by the visitors. Mr. Pigg, the Cambridgeshire captain, won the toss, and in view of the state of the wicket hesitated some time before deciding to bat first. During the opening stages the wicket played trickily, but improved, albeit it never was easy. L. J. Reid and Coulson made a useful first wicket stand, putting on fifty before the former was caught off Peel's bowling. Thus early the Beds. fielding was none too smart, and some expensive mistakes were made. Reid gave more than one chance at the wicket before his innings was closed, while Coulson and Ling were also missed. But the most expensive mistake was that which let off C. H. Pigg before he had scored. Profiting by his escape, he put on 50 at a time when runs were badly needed. When lunch time arrived Cambs. had done well in scoring 140 for two wickets. Afterwards a decided change came over the game. Ling and Watts, who were not out 50 and 20 respectively at the interval, were disposed of with the addition of only one run, while B. W. Pigg and F. Roberson each had a very short stay. Six wickets were down for 355—a very different state of affairs to 142 for two. C. H. Pigg and F. E. Collier stopped a dangerous rot, and carried the score to 191, when Orr, who bowled one over to enable Morcom to change to the other end, got Collier caught at mid-off. While the Cambs. skipper and C. H. Pigg were associated, 30 more were added, and remaining partnerships raised the total to the very respectable height of 251.

The light was very dubious when the Bedfordshire innings was commenced with B. L. Peel and W. E. King. Rose at the pavilion end bowled very fast, and would early have been credited with a couple of wickets had two chances been accepted. When he had scored three King put one up to C. H. Pigg in the slips and was missed, while Peel at six received a life at the wicket. The chances, however, were very hard ones. Forty minutes produced 40 runs, when L. J. Reid relieved Coulson, and at 51 G. Rose gave way to B. W. Pigg at the pavilion end. An hour and a quarter after the start the first wicket fell, B. W. Pigg clean bowling King. Seventy-one runs were the result of the first partnership. C. H. Pigg got a wicket, Wharmby being caught in the slips. Then runs came freely, and the hundred was hoisted an hour and a half after the start. C. H. Pigg was punished to the extent of 19 in three overs, and then gave way to Rose, while a couple of overs later Coulson bowled vice B. W. Pigg. No more wickets fell, and Beds. finished in a strong position, having only two wickets down for 138 when wickets were drawn for the day.

Upon the game being resumed on Tuesday the match was in a very open state. The first half hour's play gave Cambs. a chance of leading on the first innings as the prolonged partnership of Peel and Holdstock was promptly broken up. B. W. Pigg, from the pavilion end, bowled the first ball to Peel, who misjudged a late cut and put the ball away in the slips, where Reid brought off a splendid catch. Peel had batted for two hours for 84, which included eleven 4's, a fine exhibition marred only by one chance. The first ball of Rose's first over completely beat Holdstock. Two wickets thus fell without an addition to the score. A few overs later Orr was also bowled by Rose, and half the side were out for 150. The rapid fall of the wickets would seem to indicate that the wicket was playing badly, but such was not the case. Sutherland and Apthorp made a useful stand, which a change in the bowling, Reid for Rose, failed to break up. A second change when the total stood at 203, however, effected the purpose. Coulson, though far from well, took the ball from Reid, and in his second over got Sutherland caught in the slips. The sixth wicket put on 50 runs, and fell at 212. The three points were slipping slowly out of reach of the home county. Two opportunities of ending Leventhorpe's hitting presented themselves—one to Ling in the slips, and the second to Watts at the wicket. Both were missed, and the batsman signalled his luck by sending the two following balls to the boundary. When he was missed the total stood at 232. The partnership continued until it reached 250, when Apthorp was stumped by Watts. But the chance of leading was gone. Morcom hit a single and a boundary, and—saving for the very remote possibility of Cambs. winning outright—Beds. escaped from the bottom of the championship table at the expense of the home county. A smart one-handed catch by Rose disposed of Leventhorpe; B. W. Pigg, after badly missing Morcom in the country, made amends by capturing Foy's wicket, and Coulson caught and bowled Morcom. The innings concluded for 302.

The manner in which the Cambs. wickets commenced to fall in the second innings promised an easy win for Bedfordshire. Instructions to hit out were given, but with the exception of Roberson, who collected 59 in a short space, none of the opening batsmen sufficiently

mastered the bowling to carry out the instructions. The first wicket fell at 20, the second at 36, the third at 43, and the fourth at 44. A stand was badly needed, and Ling and B. W. Pigg put on 23, while the next wicket added 32. Ling was getting nicely set when Orr went on with his slows, and in his second over tempted the batsman beyond the crease, and Apthorp whipped off the bats. Collier played a particularly good game where others were comparative failures. When Orr went on he was cautious in dealing with the slows, but then hit out, and in three consecutive strokes scored a couple of fours and a three. Wharmby he also sent to the boundary upon more than one occasion. In half-an-hour he scored his first 50 for the County. He played free and attractive cricket until he was ninth out for 63, in which were nine 4's and five 3's. Coulson was caught in attempting to drive Orr, and the Cambs. innings, having lasted just over two hours, concluded at a quarter-past four for 158, leaving Beds. 108 to get to win. In three-quarters of an hour they had lost three wickets and had scored 65 runs. With Holdstock and Leventhorpe together, however, the necessary runs were hit off without any further loss, Beds. winning comfortably by six wickets. Full score:

CAMBRIDGESHIRE v. BEDFORDSHIRE.

In dull and cheerless weather this, the last fixture of the season of the two teams, engaged, was commenced on Fenner's at Cambridge, on Monday. The Cambs. skipper won the toss, but after the heavy shower in the morning, the wicket was very tricky. After some hesitation however, he decided that Cambs. should bat first and Reid and Coulson led off, and put on 50 before Reid, who gave two hard chances, was caught by Aphorp. Watts assisted Coulson to put on 30, when the latter succumbed to a catch by Peel. Watts and King carried the score to 142 before the luncheon interval, but on resuming only a single was added before Watts got out. With nine added, B. W. Pigg was sent back. Robertson was the fifth man out at 155, and King left at the same total. Collier and C. H. Pigg made a stand for the next wicket, Collier being out at 191 and C. H. Pigg following with 30 added. C. Pigg offered some resistance, but the other men were dismissed cheaply, and the innings closed soon after four o'clock for 251.

When Beds went in the light was very dubious. B. L. Peel and King were the first wicket pair, and made a splendid stand. Both batsmen were missed early in the innings, but after playing cautiously for a time, settled down to play attractive cricket. In spite of frequent changes in the attack, they put on the splendid total of 71 before King had his stumps disturbed by Bernard Pigg. The partnership had extended for nearly an hour and a half Wharmby came along, but after getting a single was neatly caught by B. Pigg in the slips off a delivery

from his brother. Holdstock was the next man in, and with Peel played out time, the score at the close of play for the day being 138 for two wickets, leaving Beds. in a fairly strong position. Peel played sterling cricket, and his innings so far included a dozen boundary hits. Monday's scores:—

The last of the Cambridgeshire engagements in the Minor Counties' Championship was commenced on Fenner's on Monday. The County had Bedfordshire as opponents, and upon the issue depended whichshire should finish up at the bottom of the list, Cambs. having scored 15 points, while Beds. had 13. A full team was brought by the visitors. Cambs. batted first, and Reid and Coulson put on 50 for the first wicket. The bowling was faulty, Reid, Coulson and Ling being missed in turn. Coulson made a useful 15 and Ling 50. Two wickets were down for 142, but then a collapse occurred, and the score had only been raised to 156 when the sixth wicket fell. C. H. Pigg and Collier, however, stayed the rot, and the respectable total of 251 was eventually reached.

Bedfordshire began with Peel and King, and the latter was soon missed by C. H. Pigg. To make matters worse, Peel was missed at the wicket. The latter was a very serious mistake, as the batsman was not dismissed until he had made 81. At the close of play Beds. were in a favourable position, having scored 138 for two wickets.

Resuming on Tuesday, Cambs. did well for a time, and half their opponents were dismissed for 150. Sutherland and Apthorp, however, made a useful stand, and Leventhorpe and Morcom gave further trouble, the innings eventually closing for 302, or 51 on.

Cambs.' second innings opened disastrously, four wickets being down for 44. Then Ling and B. W. Pigg made something of a stand, whilst the next wicket added 32. Collier at last found his form, and put on a fine 63, but the innings was all over for 158, which left the visitors 110 to get to win. These were speedily got, and Beds. won by six wickets. CAMBS. v. BEDFORDSHIRE.

In dull and cheerless weather this match, the last in the competition of the two teams engaged, was commenced on Fenners', at Cambridge on Monday morning. The Cambs. skipper won the toss, but the heavy shower in the morning had made the wicket very difficult, and it was after some hesitation that Mr. C. Pigg decided that Cambs. should have the first knock. L. J. Reid and Coulson led off and made a useful first-wicket stand, putting on 50 when Reid, who had given two somewhat hard chances, was caught by Apthorpe, off Peel. Ling assisted Coulson to put on 30, when Coulson succumbed to a catch by cel. and Watts and Ling were together when the luncheon interval arrived with the score at 142, Ling having made 50 and Watts 20.

On resuming only a single was added, when Watts was sent back. H. W. Pigg came along and added nine to the score. Roberson was three runs later and Ling was got rid of at the same total, he having given a good display for his 50. C. H. Pigg and Collier were together for some time and put on 30 runs for the seventh wicket, when Collier skied one from Orr to King at mid-off. With the exception of Pigg the remaining batsmen gave little trouble, and the innings closed soon after four o'clock for 257.

The light was very dubious when Beds. opened their innings with B. L. Peel and W. E. King, but the batsmen made a fine stand and in spite of frequent changes in the attack put on 71 before King had his centre stump hit by B. Pigg. Wharmby gave little trouble but Holdstock and Peel played out time, the score being 138 for two wickets. Of these Peel claimed 84 not out. He should have been caught behind the wicket when he had got only half-a-dozen, but later on in the innings he played stylish cricket.

Beds. fared somewhat disastrously when play was resumed on Tuesday morning, Peel being caught in the slips, off the first ball sent down. The first ball from Rose in the next over sent back Holdstock, the score being 138. Orr and Sutherland added 15 when Rose howled the former. Apthorp joined Sutherland and here a capital stand was made, 53 being put on before Sutherland was out to an easy catch in the slips. Leventhorp then came in, but both men had lives. Leventhorp had made 15 when he gave a chance in the slips, and he should have been caught behind the stumps off the next ball. These mistakes were expensive and probably lost Cambs. the three points they stood a good chance of obtaining on the first innings. The batsmen carried the score to 250, a run less than Cambs. got at their first venture, when Apthorp was nicely stumped by Watts. Morcom came to the wicket and helped Leventhorp to add nine, when the latter succumbed to a left-hand catch by Rose, in the slips. Morcom and Foy were together for some time although the former was badly missed by B. Pigg when he had got 18, and they carried the score to 276 when Foy was caught by Reid. Grierson came along and with Morcom took the score to 302, when the latter returned one to Coulson, and the innings closed just before the luncheon interval.

Cambs. commenced their second innings 51 behind, but the start was most disastrous, Reid and Roberson led off but with only 30 on the telegraph board Reid had his stumps disturbed by Morcom. Ling helped Roberson to put on 16 when Apthorp brought off a smart catch behind the wicket, Roberson having made 30 very quickly. C. H. Pigg was the third man out at 43, Watts failed to add to the score, and B. W. Pigg's wicket, the fifth, fell at 67. Collier became associated with Ling, and a dozen were put on when Ling, who appeared to be suffering from slight trouble with his leg, played forward to Orr and failed to get back in time. Bocoek and Collier carried the score to 110, when Bocoek was captured in the slips. Pigg came along but did not stay long, being out for obstruction at 209. Collier had then obtained 50, having taken just half an hour, and when joined by Rose continued to play attractive cricket. He, however, failed to get hold of one of Orr's slows, and skied the ball to Grierson, at mid-off. His innings included nine 4's and five 3's. Coulson was nicely caught in the long field by Sutherland, with the total score 138, leaving Beds. 108 to get to win.

Peel and King put on 25 for the first wicket, and some steady batting by Wharmby Holdstock and Leventhorp enabled them to win by six wickets, the match finishing just before six. Scores:—

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP. Cambs. v. Bedfordshire.

The last of the Cambridgeshire engagements in the Minor Counties' Championship was commenced on Fenner's this morning. The County had Bedfordshire as opponents, and upon the issue depended which shire should finish up at the bottom of the list. Cambs. having scored 15 points, while Beds. had 131. A full team was brought by the visitors. Mr. Pigg, the Cambridgeshire captain, won the toss, and in view of the state of the wicket hesitated some time before deciding to bat first. During the opening stages the wicket played trickily, but improved, albeit it never was easy. L. J. Reid and Coulson made a useful first wicket stand, putting on fifty before the former was caught off Peel's bowling. Thus early the Beds. fielding was none too smart, and some expensive mistakes were made. Reid gave more than one chance at the wicket before his innings was closed, while Coulson and Ling were also missed. But the most expensive mistake was that which let off C. H. Pigg before he had scored. Profiting by his escape, he put on 50 at a time when runs were badly needed. When lunch time arrived Cambs. had done well in scoring 140 for two wickets. Afterwards a decided change came over the game. Ling and Watts, who were not out 50 and 20 respectively at the interval, were disposed of with the addition of only one run, while B. W. Pigg and F. Roberson each had a very short stay. Six wickets were down for 155—a very different state of affairs to 142 for two. C. H. Pigg and F. E. Collier stopped a dangerous run, and carried the score to 191, when Orr, who bowled one over to enable Morcom to change to the other end, got Collier caught at mid-off. While the captain and "C. H." were associated, 30 more were added, and remaining partnerships raised the total to the very respectable height of 251.

The fight was very dubious when the Bedfordshire innings was commenced with B. L. Peel and W. E. King. Rose at the pavilion end bowled very fast, and would early have been credited with a couple of wickets had two chances been accepted. When he had scored three King put one up to C. H. Pigg in the slips and was missed, while Peel at six received a life at the wicket. The chances, however, were very hard ones. Forty minutes produced 40 runs, when L. J. Reid relieved Coulson, and at 51 G. Rose gave way to B. W. Pigg at the pavilion end.

MINOR COUNTIES CHAMPIONSHIP. Cambs. v. Bedfordshire. BEDS. WIN BY SIX WICKETS.

When the match was resumed on Fenner's this morning it was in a very open state. Bedfordshire for the loss of two wickets overnight had scored 138—not 188, as was stated by a printer's error—and the first half-hour's play this morning gave Cambs. a better chance of claiming the lead on the first innings. The prolonged partnership of Peel and Holdstock was promptly broken up. B. W. Pigg, from the pavilion end, bowled the first ball to Peel, who misjudged a late cut and put the ball away in the slips, where Reid brought off a splendid catch. Peel had batted for two hours for 84, which included eleven 4's, a fine exhibition marred only by one chance. The first ball of Rose's first over completely beat Holdstock. Two wickets thus fell without an addition to the score. A few overs later Orr was also bowled by Rose, and half the side were out for 150. The rapid fall of the wickets would seem to indicate that the wicket was playing badly, but such was not the case. Sutherland and Apthorp made a useful stand, which a change in the bowling, Reid for Rose, failed to break up. A second change when the total stood at 203, however, effected the purpose. Coulson, though far from well, took the ball from Reid, and in his second over got Sutherland caught in the slips. The sixth wicket put on 59 runs, and fell at 212. The three points were slipping slowly out of reach of the home county. Every run was precious, and the Cambs. field worked three hits to the boundary, and twice the field was rearranged with the object of keeping down the score. Two opportunities of ending Leventhorpe's hitting presented themselves—one to Ling in the slips and the second to Watts at the wicket. Both were missed, and the batsman signalled his luck by sending the two following balls to the boundary. When he was missed the total stood at 232. The partnership continued until it reached 250, when Apthorp was stumped by Watts. But the chance of leading was gone. Morcom hit a single and a boundary, and—saving for the very remote possibility of Cambs. winning outright—Beds. escaped from the bottom of the championship table at the expense of the home county. A smart one-handed catch by Rose disposed of Leventhorpe; B. W. Pigg, after badly missing Morcom in the country, made amends by capturing Foy's wicket, and Coulson caught and bowled Morcom. The innings concluded for 302.

The manner in which the Cambs. wickets commenced to fall in the second innings promised an easy win for Bedfordshire. Instructions to hit out were given, but with the exception of Roberson, who collected 30 in a short space, none of the opening batsmen sufficiently mastered the bowling to carry out the instructions. The first wicket fell at 20, the second at 36, the third at 43, and the fourth at 44. A stand was badly needed, and Ling and B. W. Pigg put on 23, while the next wicket added 32. Ling was just getting nicely set when Orr went on with his slow, and in his second over tempted the batsman beyond the crease, and Apthorp whipped off the balls. Collier played a particularly good game where others were comparative failures. He has had ill luck in this season's county cricket, but seemed to have reached the edge of the bad patch. When Orr went on he was cautious in dealing with the slow, but then hit out, and in three consecutive strokes scored a couple of fours and a three. Wharmby he also sent to the boundary upon more than one occasion. In half-an-hour he scored his first 50 for the County. In this season Colts' Match he hit up a half-century, but has never before reached those figures in a county match. He played free and attractive cricket until he was ninth out for 63, in which were nine fours and five threes. Coulson was caught in attempting to drive Orr, and the Cambs. innings, having lasted just over two hours, concluded at a quarter-past four for 158, leaving Beds. 108 to get to win. In three-quarters of an hour they had lost three wickets and had scored 65 runs. The required number were obtained by a quarter to six, and Beds. won by six wickets.

In their second venture, Cambs. were only able to put on the very moderate score of 158, despite a great effort on the part of F. E. Collier. For his 63 this player shaped beautifully. F. Roberson also played well for his 30.

Left with only 108 runs to get to win, Beds. commenced their second innings about two hours before time. They forced the game with the result that they obtained the necessary runs for the loss of four wickets. By so doing Bedfordshire gained the full maximum of points, and thus by their defeat Cambridge, who at the beginning of the match had 15 points to their opponents 133, will occupy bottom position in the table of this group.
