ONLY A COUPLE OF VICTORIES.

DERBYSHIRE'S DEPRESSING RECORD.

At Trent Bridge yesterday Derbyshire concluded a season which has brought them little but anxiety and acute disappointment, and doubtless those who set out four months ago with a fixed determination to revive interest in the game and the club are not sorry that the last engagement has been fulfilled. They have encountered great difficulties and discouragement, and it is a matter for regret that their efforts have met with such poor success. Until the affairs of the club have been properly examined it is impossible to say exactly what the position is, but there is pretty certain to be a formidable balance on the wrong side, as the support accorded the home matches has been extremely poor. Bad weather has accounted in some measure for the meagre attendances, but the feeble displays of the team have unquestionably done much to kill interest. The record of the side is truly deplorable, infinitely worse than a year ago, with only two victories to show, compared with five in 1908, and the string of defeats is painful to contemplate. Throughout the summer the club has been considerably handicapped by the inability to get together a capable eleven. At the outset it was obvious that Derbyshire were weak in batting, and all the experiments tried were doomed to failure. The policy of the committee in recruiting from local clubs was pursued, as in former years, with equally unsatisfactory results. It not infrequently happened that the aspirant got his chance under circumstances which were not calculated to inspire him with confidence. He was often required to go in to check a collapse, and employing methods quite foreign to his nature made an inglorious debut. With one notable exception, no one came forward to take the place of those whose skill is on the wane until the last few weeks of the season, and by that time Derbyshire had sunk to the lowest depths with no possibility of repairing the damage. If the Peak County cricket is to be improved it can only be done by the establishment of a nursery, and that will mean the expenditure of money. The finances of the club at present are in an impoverished condition, but if some means could be devised to place them once more upon a sounder basis, the idea ought to receive earnest and serious consideration, for there is no alternative scheme, and it would be simply suicidal to allow matters to drift along in the old sweet way.

SEASON'S WORK ANALYSED.

The wet wickets which we have experienced in the analogy for an English summer were not of the character Derbyshire could be expected to distinguish themselves upon, but that does not excuse the many ineffectual batting displays. Repeatedly the side, with all its shortcomings, had an opportunity of gaining a commanding advantage, but it was rarely utilised, and on the few occasions when Derbyshire found themselves on top, the inevitable procession deprived them of any chance they might otherwise have possessed of snatching a victory. Commencing their programme much earlier than usual, Derbyshire had taken part in no fewer than seven matches, five of which had ended in defeat, ere they were permitted to taste the sweets of victory, Warwickshire, who like the Penikites have fallen on evil times, being decisively beaten at the picturesque little ground belonging to the Coventry club. A slight improvement manifested itself after this, but it was not maintained for long, and the team had to wait until August Bank Holiday week before they again found the winning track at Leicester. This triumph over the hunting shire was indeed a brilliant performance and constituted the one redeeming feature of a depressing season. In the interval Derbyshire had participated in a Southern tour with very little success, and until the end of the chapter they continued to meet with a bulky and heavy defeat. Kent, Essex, and Northampton had taken the maximum number of points, and Derbyshire, Peckham, who, in several instances, were required to do little against some of their own members by appointments on pitches which spelled disaster from the start. Lancashire, Sussex, Devonshire, and Leicestershire each defeated them, and of the matches which were drawn, Derbyshire was saved by a narrow margin. At the close of Sussex at Derby, and one unfortunate result at Worcester, Warwickshire drew. Another half season would have been sufficient. Against Yorkshire at Sheffield they fought courageously and valiantly, and had the batting been marked by a number of brilliant innings quite on the cards that they would have won the liberty of thrashing the "Tykes." Outside the championship list Derbyshire only played one match, namely, with the Australians, and the colonials proved immeasurably superior all round. The solitary game allocated to Glossop, which

was completely ruined by rain, for not a ball was bowled, and it was distinctly fortunate that the club had a generous patron like Mr. S. Hill Wood to guarantee them against such a serious loss. In the hope of discovering what the committee arranged for a number of tours made in various parts of the county, but the experiment was not attended with the success hoped for.

FEATURELESS BATTING.

As already indicated the batting was the principal source of weakness. Occasionally it was characterised by enterprise and stability, but in the majority of cases it was extremely weak. The form of several members of the side was altogether too bad to be true, and had they received more of field Fortune's smiles and less of the frowns we should not have had so many inglorious break-downs to record. Cadman alone of the recognised run-getters can regard the season with any satisfaction, and is to be heartily congratulated on aggregating four figures. The Glossop professional was remarkably consistent, and rescued his side from an apparently hopeless situation time and again. Only once did he enjoy the distinction of reaching the century, but his was very near it on several occasions. He headed the averages with a lot to spare, Morton coming second. Morton experienced in different luck, breaking down several times through minor injuries, but his work with the bat was not so impressive as in former years. L. G. Wright played the game with the same spirit of cheery optimism and enthusiasm, but after twenty-one years of county cricket the veteran's eye is not so true, and it was only at rare intervals was he privileged to get a glimpse of the real "L. G." Needham, too, was very disappointing, and it was not until the season had nearly run its course that he attained to the brilliant standard he reached twelve months ago. Warren and L. Oliver manifested a steady advance and while neither of them accomplished anything really great, they played with pronounced resolution and a certain amount of cleverness. J. Chapman, who came into the side early in May, caused something of a sensation by scoring 100 against Warwickshire at Coventry, and displaying a measure of skill which surprised everyone. The old Uppingham Rover looked like supplying a long felt want in the Derbyshire eleven, but with the advent of sticky wickets he did little. Without doubt, however, Chapman is a fine cricketer, and under favourable conditions we should see this polished amateur batsman to more advantage. A. E. Lawton's appearances were, to the general regret, few and far between, partly on account of business claims and partly in consequence of an accident which befell him at Southampton, and disabled him for several weeks. The moral influence which the hard hitting captain exercises over the team counts for a great deal, and it was a big misfortune for the eleven that he was unable to assist them more frequently. R. B. Rickman, who assumed command in his absence, also met with a mishap which deprived the County of his services for some time, but it was gratifying to find that G. Curran and R. Sale were induced to help in a few of the later matches, as their inclusion materially strengthened the batting. The first named played pretty regularly a few seasons ago, and if he could find it convenient to devote more time to the game it will be greatly to the benefit of the side, for his all round ability is undoubted.

THE REDEMING POINTS.

There was little fault to be found with the attack, though the wickets were scarcely likely to excel. Despite this fact Warren for all matches captured 99 wickets during the season at a cost of 22.25 and Bestwick claimed 75, which cost a fraction more. The Glossop professional was not always available owing to some breaches of discipline, but on his day he accomplished some very smart performances. By way of compensation for his determination as a batsman, Morton proved more destructive as a bowler, but Cadman lost a lot of his sting, largely as the result of experimenting. Derbyshire suffered severely by their failure to discover a really good left arm bowler. Bracey was afforded an adequate trial, but disappointed sadly, and it would appear useless to persevere with him longer under the circumstances. Humphries improved with the bat considerably, and kept wicket magnificently, and it was a big disappointment to Derbyshire enthusiasts that his prowess was not officially recognised by his inclusion in the English team in one or more of the Tests. In one branch of the game Derbyshire's work was beyond reproach, namely, their fielding. At all times it was keen and smart, and frequently reached a brilliant standard. The efforts of L. G. Wright at point, of J. Chapman at cover, and of Warren, Cadman, and L. Oliver in all positions were particularly fine, and commanded universal admiration. A complete list of the results, and the averages are appended.

CRICKET RETROSPECTS.

LEICESTERSHIRE'S SEASON.

A DISAPPOINTING RECORD.

There has been little in the doings of Leicestershire this year to cause supporters of the county team to regret the disappearance of cricket for the season. Truth to tell, the hunting shire have had a series of disappointing experiences, unrelieved save for the short space of a fortnight in June, when, at the top of their form, the side would have given practically any team a hard game. There have, of course, been several good performances since that time, but these have not been numerous, and in a general way those who hoped for a reproduction of the county's splendid form in 1905 have been sadly out in their calculations.

Inconsistency has been very marked during the greater part of the season, and the only men upon whom it has been possible to rely, with any degree of certainty, however moderate, have been Knight, King, and Crawford. In few cases, other than in the match with Notts at Trent Bridge, when, despite the ultimate defeat, the side put up a stalwart resistance, and against Surrey this week have Leicestershire managed to rise to a great occasion and feeble cricket has been shown at periods when steady nerves and self-confidence were absolutely essential.

The mainstay of the team this season has, of course, been King, who with better support would have carried the county into a much higher position than it occupies. The Lutterworth professional has thoroughly demonstrated his claim to be considered one of the best of present day all-round cricketers, for while he has most excelled with the bat, several good performances with the ball stand to his credit. King reached the highest point in his career when he was included in the English team to meet the Australians in the Test Match at Lord's, in which he thoroughly justified his selection. For his county he has done several magnificent things this season, and has been practically the only batsman in any way able to play his natural game under difficulties. Although he started quietly, Knight afterwards found his form, and some of his displays have been remarkable for their attractiveness. In several instances Knight has shown a punishing power such as has not often characterised his batting, and he has undoubtedly had a capital season. The great disappointment of the campaign has been the doings of Whitehead, who after a series of ineffective exhibitions was left out, much to the regret of all concerned, for the Barlestone man at the top of his form was as well worth watching as most batsmen. Mr. D. J. B. Wood has done useful work, and Mr. V. F. S. Crawford's brilliance has been exemplified upon a number of occasions, but Coe has hardly met with the success which attended him in the previous season. Marked improvement as a batsman has been made by Sir Arthur Hunslerigg, who has a steadiness of nerve with which one or two of his others could very well do, and he had the satisfaction in the match with Derbyshire at Aylestone Road of scoring his first 50 in county cricket.

BOWLING AND FIELDING.

In the bowling department the most consistent work has been accomplished by Jayes, and even he lost his deadliness to some extent just when it was the most required, so that formidable batting sides found the Leicestershire attack easy to obtain runs from. Jayes, however, should come again, as also should Astill, who has been this season one of the disappointments. Jayes, by the way, has twice this year taken two wickets in his opening over, against Kent at Leicester, and against Warwickshire at Edgbaston. King's thoughtful bowling was frequently extremely troublesome to batsmen, and Mr. Wood and Coe have been useful occasionally as change bowlers. Shipman has come on rather rapidly during the last two months as a fast bowler, but there is no doubt that the side has been handicapped by the loss of Mr. W. W. Ockell, with whose assistance they could very well do again. He helped Leicestershire once only, against the Australians, when he took four wickets in the match for 75 runs.

In the field a good deal has been left to be desired. Upon occasion the ground fielding was keen, and in this respect mention may be made of the fine work invariably accomplished by Jayes, who has deservedly gained the reputation of being one of the finest mid-on's in the country, and by Knight at cover. Astill has also fielded well as a rule, stopping some hits at point that would have beaten many fieldsmen, while behind the wicket Mr. J. Shields wore the gloves as cleverly as here and there a one. A tribute to Mr. Shields' powers was his selection to keep wicket for the Gentlemen in both matches, and those who saw the play say that he took Mr. D. W. Carr's googlies, which he had never previously seen, splendidly. Still, dropped catches have had a good deal this year to do with Leicestershire's lowly state, chances missed at critical periods having in more than one instance in all probability turned victory into defeat.

It is satisfactory to reflect that several young players have made their mark with the side during the season. Of Shipman's bowling mention has already been made, but he has also shown excellent form with the bat, hitting with rare zest, and is quite likely to develop into a most useful batsman of the forcing type. Turner (R. F.), the Everton footballer, came into the side when Whitehead lost his place, and retained it, playing some really admirable innings, and displaying the possession of a cool confidence and imperturbability which should serve him well. He is quite the most promising young batsman discovered by Leicestershire for some time. Mr. A. T. Sharp, the Reptonian, revealed a good style, and has probably excellent cricket in him if the county authorities give it a chance to come out by playing him more frequently, as next season they might very well do.
