As explained in the Introduction, the headers to the scorecards are colour-coded to indicate how comprehensive the scorecard currently is, and how well the feat in question has, or has not, been authenticated from the many sources investigated. This colour-coding is echoed in a number from 1 to 6 placed in the top right-hand corner of each scorecard. The coding used in the third edition differs to some extent from that used in previous editions; the categories are now defined as follows:

1 (Green) Scorecards of matches in which the details and authenticity of the 'major feat' in question have been corroborated from the sources named, and scorecard details confirming the feat have been traced.

Instances of pre-1983 feats that appear well-sourced but that were not included in Ernest Gross's own lists are given the number '1N'. These feats may have been omitted by Gross because they never came to his attention, or because he knew about them but had some reason for doubting their authenticity. At present there is no clear evidence on which to base any such doubt – beyond the fact that they were not listed by Gross.

2 (Yellow) As above, except that the exact details of the feat are not confirmed in the sources named, even though the scorecard suggests that it is very likely. (Usually this applies in the case of large partnerships, where the scorecard shows that a substantial number of runs were added for a particular wicket, but where the precise number of runs in the partnership is not stated.)

3 (Pale tan) As Categories 1 or 2 above, but with few if any scorecard details available.

4 (Orange) Instances in which no grounds have been found to doubt the authenticity of the feat as recorded in the sources named, but no further or corroborating details have to date been traced.

5 (Red) Instances that cannot be corroborated despite attempts to do so in a range of sources, and for which the evidence available – or lack of it – gives rise to strong suspicions that the feat as recorded by Gross or others may not have occurred at all.

6 (Blue) Matches already in Cricket Archive, but where research for this project has identified significant additional or corrected details of the scorecard as given there.

The dividing-lines between these classes are not always clear-cut. In particular, some matches currently in Category 4 appear very close to meriting inclusion in Category 5; but in such cases the matches have, for now at least, been given the benefit of the doubt and left in Category 4.

Scorecard from the *Vancouver Daily Province*, 4 September 1945, which notes that Bill Hendy hit 12 fours and seven sixes in his 125*, and then took all ten of his opponents' wickets in "a great display of perfect-length bowling, which broke from both off and leg".

Robert Brooke includes Hendy's performance in this match in his list of instances of a player scoring a century and taking all-ten in the same match, included in 'Milestones' in *The Cricketer* August 1990 page 32. It is also in the equivalent list in *Cricket Quarterly* Summer 1967 page 135. Brooke (but not CQ) incorrectly gives Hendy's initials as 'AS'; AS Hendy, who played for Canada against MCC in 1951, was a different cricketer.

Gross says that G Allen took all ten wickets in an innings for no runs for Bittern.

The feat is mentioned in a number of newspapers in Trove, but none of those sources includes a scorecard. Some report that Allen was 26 years old. The scorecard details as given here are taken from *Bradman's of the Bush* by Ken Piesse & Alf Wilson.

The *Sporting Globe* (Melbourne) of 16 November said that Gordon Allen was a medium-pace bowler. The *Barrier Miner* (and several other papers, using a common report) adds that Somerville did not score a single run – though this is clearly incorrect, as the above scorecard shows.

This was an A grade match in the Northern [Mornington] Peninsula competition. The Mornington Peninsula lies just to the south of the city of Melbourne.

A report in the *Armidale Express & New England General* of 3 April 1947 refers to the achievement of Jim Fletcher, who took 19 wickets for 60 runs in the match for Colts, in 26 overs: nine wickets in the first innings, ten in the second. No other details are given, beyond the fact that this was a Walcha Grade A match, played at "the park". No other reference to the match is currently (April 2023) in Trove.

Fletcher's performance of 19 wickets in the match is not recorded by Gross.

In Alfred James' *Statistical Appendix to the Centenary History of the New South Wales Districts Cricket Associations 1903 to 2003*, it is recorded (on page 36) that L Ferguson took 19 wickets for 86 runs for Callan Park in this match in the City Houses A Grade Association.

Additional information from the *Sydney Morning Herald* 2 April 1947 and the *Sydney Sun* of the same date: Les Ferguson took 9-53 and 10-33 in the match, with the other Postal wicket falling to a run-out. The order of innings and team scores are not given.

No further information about this performance has yet been traced. It is not noted in any other newspaper currently (April 2023) in Trove.

SOA second innings bowling (taken from the SOA report) adds two runs too many. Gross says that Marshall took 19-89 in the match, while the *Sidmouth Herald* expressly says that he took 10-60 in the second innings figures, in which case the bowling adds three runs too few. The SOA report is the only one supplying full bowling figures for both teams, so I have followed that in this instance.

JMA Marshall is the Warwickshire spinner who played for the county between 1946 and 1950.

Usherwood later took up wicketkeeping in preference to bowling. He moved to Brighton College and played for their First XI in 1955 and 1956. *Wisden* 1957 described him as 'a fine captain and reliable wicket-keeper'.

The *Telegraph* confirms that St Alban's first wicket fell at 4, and that at close of play the total had reached 411-1, thus confirming the partnership as 407*. The batters concerned were Vincent Cleary (46 fours) and Stacy Atkin (16 fours), both stated to be over 40 years old. According to the *St George Call*, the partnership lasted 183 minutes.

It is not known if there was further play on any later date.

This was a match in the NSW Churches Cricket Association (St George Area Union) B Grade, Western Division

Atkin served as secretary and treasurer of the NSW Churches Cricket Union for over 50 years, a record that earned him a place in the authoritative *Oxford Companion to Australian Cricket* (1996).

Gross records that IHS Balfour scored 128 and 139*, and took 12 wickets for 39 runs, for South Stamford Boys in this match. This feat is also noted in *The Cricket Statistician* no. 20 (December 1977), where the details are said to have come from Balfour himself. This article says his first-innings score was 128 not out, and that his bowling figures for the two innings were 7-10 and 5-29.

Although the match is said to have been played at Stamford School, there is no mention of it in contemporary issues of *The Stamfordian*, so it may have been a 'town' match rather than a school fixture.

There is no reference to this match in contemporary issues of the *Lincoln, Rutland & Stamford Mercury*; but the newspaper's cricket coverage is in any case minimal.

Balfour's performances in 1948, when he would have been around 14 years old, are something of a mystery. Neither this match nor the house match in which he is reported as taking all 20 of his opponents' wickets (for Town House v Country House & School House in 1948; full scorecard in Cricket Archive) is mentioned in the school magazine covering that summer. Neither is he listed in the school's averages in any subsequent season when he might have been expected to have been still at the school. Moreover, a member of the present writer's family who was at Stamford School at the same time as Balfour's reported performances – and who was himself a cricketer, if not of First XI standard – has no recollection of him at all.

Balfour however remained (reluctantly) willing to confirm these performances to Ernest Gross – see a piece on pages 5-6 of issue 20 of *The Cricket Statistician* (December 1977), and a follow-up on page 16 of issue 23 (October 1978).

Nevertheless, in the absence of any contemporary evidence, the jury is still out concerning the veracity of these performances.

In Alfred James' *Statistical Appendix to the Centenary History of the New South Wales Districts Cricket Associations 1903 to 2003*, it is recorded (on page 38) that C Whittaker and G Walters shared a partnership of 232 for Marrickville Presbyterians' eighth wicket, in this match in the NSW Churches C Grade Association.

The above details have been traced in the *St George Call* newspaper (Kogarah, NSW) editions of 3 and 10 December 1948. The match is shown as being played in the St George Division of the NSW Churches' Union.

Both the full MCC scorecard and the MCC book of potted scores for the season give the Services second innings total as 179, but this cannot be correct as that would have been insufficient to secure victory. Other sources give the score as 182-4; as the scorecard makes no reference to any Extras in the innings, to make it balance correctly it is assumed that the innings included three Extras.

The scorer initially wrote the name of D Treffrey as Services' no. 11, but this name was then struck through and replaced by 'O/C Williams'. It appears that Williams was allowed to play as a full substitute for Treffrey, who [may have been] injured or called away after bowling two overs in MCC's first innings.

White played a total of 21 first-class matches between 1937 and 1949, for Cambridge U, Northants, the Army and the Combined Services.

Gross says that wicketkeeper B Wootton made seven stumpings in an innings for Headstone.

The *Harrow Observer* only gives the brief score of this fixture (as above) in its issue of 26 July 1951, and makes no mention of any such feat by Wootton. However, the following week's edition refers to Wootton as having made "a brilliant wicket-keeping performance the previous Sunday [which from the report is 22 July], when he stumped seven opponents and caught one". So the performance is corroborated, even if no scorecard can be found. The very brief note in the *News Chronicle* confirms the date and venue (which was on Maurice's home ground, and not at Pinner as claimed by Gross), and also confirms that Wootton caught one and stumped seven.

Approaches in 2020 to Parkfield & Headstone CC, successors to the Headstone club, sadly drew a blank.

The *Middlesex County Times* may be the only remaining hope for finding out more on this performance. The match is not noted in the *Ruislip-Northwood Gazette*.

The 'B Wootton' referred to by Gross is Bernard Arthur Wootton of Lichfield CC (Cricket Archive player number 2250257), who is known (from reports in the *Harrow Observer*) to have moved away from NW London after the 1962 season and is first recorded as playing for Lichfield in 1963. He was the father of Warwickshire and Gloucestershire cricketer Simon Wootton – who has also been unable to supply any additional information regarding this match.

This match was not included in the original list in *Cricketer Quarterly* Summer 1967 page 135 of instances of a player scoring a century and taking all-ten [or better] in the same match, but came to notice through an addendum item that appeared in *CQ* volume 7, on page 53. It is also included in the equivalent list in Robert Brooke's 'Milestones' column in *The Cricketer* August 1990 page 32]. The *CQ* item dates the performance to 1953/54, while Brooke gives a date of 1952/53.

Both sources say that RG Pollock scored 117* and took 10-25 in an innings for Grey College. Future star Graeme Pollock would have been between 8 and 10 years old at the time.

No further details have yet been traced, but in light of the celebrity of the player concerned, they must surely be out there somewhere!

This match was included in the list in *Cricket Quarterly* Summer 1967 page 135 of instances of a player scoring a century and taking all-ten in the same match. It is also included in the equivalent list in Robert Brooke's 'Milestones' column in *The Cricketer* August 1990 page 32.

Brooke says that S Amba Wattee [given as S Ambawattee in CQ] scored 103* and took 10-45 in an innings for Mahinda College, while in *The Janashakthi book of Sri Lanka Cricket 1832-1996*, SS Perera names the player as HS Ambawatte and says he scored 137 and took 10-44 in the first innings (and 5-73 in the second). These details match those given in an addendum item in *Cricket Quarterly* vol 6 on page 206. The above fuller match details are taken from the *Times/Sunday Times of Ceylon* of 21 and 22 March 1953 (with thanks to Philip Bailey) and because they are contemporary reports of the match, they are preferred.

One of Ambawatte(e)'s team-mates in this match was wicketkeeper WB Bennett(e), who is reported to have dismissed eight batters in the game (six of them in the first innings). As noted in the scorecard on the next page, Bennett is reported as making ten dismissals in an innings in a similar fixture in the same season, but to date it has not yet been possible to corroborate this achievement. In private correspondence, Philip Bailey has speculated that the alleged Bennett feat may have somehow got mixed up with the Ambawatte all-ten.

Gross records that wicketkeeper WN Bennett had a hand in all ten dismissals in an innings in a school match in Ceylon, recording four catches and six stumpings. If so, this is the only known 'certain' example of a wicket-keeper's 'all ten' (but see page 362 below).

The feat is also noted in other sources, which say that Bennett was playing for Mahinda College against Galle CC. *Wisden* however records the feat differently, saying it was for Mahinda College against Richmond College, and that his victims consisted of six catches and four stumpings.

Gross and *Wisden* say the match was in the 1952/53 season, and an online article about this feat (at www.island.lk/2010/03/25/features3.html) dates it precisely to 1 March 1953. However, the records in ESPNcricinfo say the feat was performed in 1954, while correspondence with George Thomas says that the feat is referred to in the *Ceylon Observer* of 3 February 1950 (taking this from SS Perera's Sri Lankan cricket history).

But searches of the *Ceylon Observer* for the first few days of February 1950 – and the first few days of March, in case a date of '3.2.50' should be interpreted as 2 March – have drawn a blank: there is no reference to the feat at all. There is also nothing about the match, or the feat, in the Ceylonese newspapers at the British Library covering the 1952/53 season (*Times of Ceylon, Ceylon Daily News*).

George Thomas has said (in private correspondence) that Bennett was playing for Galle, not against them; but this is contradicted by the online article referred to above, which is unequivocal that he was playing for Mahinda College, and that Galle CC were his opponents and not Richmond College.

Cricket Quarterly vol 7 no. 1 page 18 names the wicketkeeper as WJ Bennette, and dates the feat to 1954.

The authenticity of this performance remains an unsolved mystery. (See also the notes on the match on page 355.)

Gross, and various other sources, say that Chaman Lal (aka M Chamanlal, CA player 38485) scored 502* for Mahendra College (aka Mahindra or Mohindra College), but no further details have been found either in contemporary newspapers or by attempts to contact the college itself.

Gross also says that the innings included 78 boundaries, of which 76 were fours; and that Chaman Lal's next innings was a score of 360. Other sources say that he went on to score over 1000 runs in the course of three innings.

In an email from Indian statistician Rajneesh Gupta to the present writer, dated 2 February 2020 (12 days before Chamanlal's death), Gupta wrote "I managed to talk to the man himself today! He clearly remembers about the innings and told me that he hit 80 fours and two sixes in his innings. This innings was followed by another innings of 365 and a 140 thereafter. Unfortunately, he did not have any newspaper clipping or other material to share with me."

In the absence of contemporary corroboration, this must go down as a 'not proven' instance, and possibly a fanciful one.

In an email dated 28 May 2020, Sreeram B Iyer passed on the fact that the obituary of PG ('Nana') Joshi in *Indian Cricket 1987* says that in a match in the Poona Summer League in 1957/58 he 'had a hand in all ten dismissals'.

This could, of course, have included one or more run-outs, and/or been spread across two innings.

The match is reported in the *Times of India* on 16 May 1958 in the following terms:

"Poona 13 May – Nana Joshi, India's former Test wicket-keeper, struck brilliant form behind the stumps in the summer cricket league of the Poona District Association. He had a hand in the dismissal of all the ten batsmen. Joshi, who helped YMCA to an outright victory over Tayabia Cricket Club, showed perfect understanding with the YMCA bowlers DG Chowdhury, a former Maharashtra star, and Subash Bhambure ... Joshi also showed good form with the bat when hitting up an unbeaten 68 [sic] out of the total of 117 runs."

The summarised scores of the match are then given as above (including Joshi scoring 62 rather than 68). There is no full scorecard, and no explicit mention in the report that all the dismissals were in the same innings, or how many of them were caught, stumped, or run out (but note that the bowling figures as given do not allow for run-outs in either Tayabia innings).

A report of the feat in the *Norwood News* of 14 August 1959 names the player as Dick Harman (of Tooting & Mitcham FC, and Mitcham CC), and confirms his score of 119* (made in 75 minutes) but gives his bowling figures as 10-67.

There is no reference to this match in contemporary issues of the *Tooting & Balham Gazette*, the *Mitcham & Colliers Wood Gazette*, or the *Merton & Morden News*. It is also not mentioned in the edition of the *News of the World* dated 16 August 1959, which might perhaps have been expected to note such a performance by one of its own.

Reported in the *Harrow Observer* of 22 September 1960 that OG Voicke made six stumpings (and an unknown number of catches) in Rosedale's second innings. An item in the same newspaper on 24 November 1960 names the keeper as GB Voicke; since this later report is of a speech made by the player's brother, it may be assumed to be more reliable.

The match is not mentioned in the *Harrow Post* of 21 September 1960. The list of forthcoming fixtures in previous week's edition (14 September) names the fixture as 'West Herts v Pinner South'. Today, West Herts CC play in Watford, whereas Rosedale is a location close in Cheshunt, so it is not 100% clear which team was opposing Pinner South in this match, and where.

Gross says that JH Hoad scored 202* and took 10-29 in an innings for United Services. The feat is also noted in *The Cricketer* Winter Annual 1962 (no. 11 page 36), though it is not clear from this report which team Hoad was playing for, and in an item on page 53 of volume 7 of the *Cricketer Quarterly*, which says that Hoad was playing for United Services. *The Cricketer* says that he bowled 17.4 overs, and that he is the son of Test cricketer ELG Hoad.

Searches to date for anything more on this have been unrewarded, and the genuineness of the performance remains in doubt. There is no mention of the match, or the feat, in 1962 editions of the *Merton & Morden News*, the *Wimbledon Borough Gazette*, the *Mitcham & District Advertiser*, the *South London Press*, the *Tooting & Balham Gazette*, or the *Clapham Observer*, or in any newspaper currently in the BNA. The *Clapham Observer* and the *Balham & Tooting News* give summary scores of nearly all matches played by a United Services side (named in one case as 'United Services [Balham]') in 1962 – the weekend of 14/15 July is the only one for which no United Services scores are given. Several of the scorecards for other weekends give full team details; no player named Hoad appears in any of them, or in the summary scores for the club.

A team named United Services Bromley has also been traced in 1962 – but if this was a fixture between two Bromley sides from south-east of London, why was it recorded as taking place at Morden, in southwest London?

Whether the visiting team was from Bromley in Kent, or Bromley-by-Bow in East London, or somewhere else is unclear; it may even have been Bramley rather than Bromley. (But a Bromley Wanderers side from Kent has been noted in a fixture in 1966.)

The feat is mentioned on page 53 of *Cricketer Quarterly* vol 7 no. 2, with the same details as given by Gross except that there is no mention of Hoad being 'not out'.

The feats of 15-year-old Colin Cust in scoring 294*, and of his team in recording 485 runs without loss, are attested in *Cricket Quarterly* (vol 1 no. 2 pp 62-63), which records that his innings lasted 150 minutes (reaching 100 in 58 minutes and 200 in 112). If correct, this means that the team's runs in the innings were made at a rate of over three per minute.

The feat is also noted on pages 90-91 of Ken Piesse's *Extraordinary book of Australian cricket*, which records that Cust 's 294* included 53 fours and two sixes, and that his opening partner John Stint retired hurt on 102* with the score at 298-0. The name of the third batsman in the partnership is not stated; to make the scorecard balance, the most he could have scored is 89*.

This was a match in Zone A of the Junior (Under-16) section of the Melbourne's Eastern Suburban Churches competition. Matches in this competition were normally played over two days, and generally played on matting. 485-0 was the Presbyterians' score at close of play on the first day of this game; no details of any play on a second day have been traced. However, the Records section in the history of the East Suburban Churches CA (*Cricket in the Park*, by Mervyn JC Shaw, 1975) gives this as the final team score, indicating that the team innings – though not necessarily the match – did not extend into a second day.

Gross refers to the match as Elgin County v Ross County, and the Elgin CC scoresheet (which is a typescript, not the original scorebook) also has Elgin as the home side. But the *Aberdeen Press & Journal* gives the venue as Strathpeffer in Ross & Cromarty, in which case Ross County were at home. The Elgin CC source is preferred; whatever the venue, the winning team is correctly just 'Elgin'.

In the event of inconsistency between the sources, players' surnames and initials are taken from the Elgin CC scoresheet. The reliability of this is, however, uncertain: e.g. the Ross County no. 5 is given as 'Niven' in the batting details, but as 'Nevin' in the bowling. Other differences in the *Press & Journal*: in the Elgin side, F Moir, R Draffen, Stewarton; for Ross County, G Sheils, J Frazer. Stewartson and Northcliffe sometimes given as Stewardson and Northcliff. The bowling order here is as given in the Elgin scoresheet.

Bernard Woolfson dismissed Kenny and Hendry with the first two balls of the Ross County innings, and both he and David Murray took three wickets in their respective second overs.

This was a match in the North of Scotland League. The reason why Ross County fielded only ten players is not known.

Gross says that D Poole took all ten wickets in an innings for no runs for Taunton's (which is a school in Southampton, and not in Somerset; it is now known as Richard Taunton's Sixth Form College). The feat is also noted in Southampton's *Southern Evening Echo* of 26 July 1966 and in a letter in *The Cricketer* 1966 (no. 12 page 18, dated 12 August 1966). Both sources confirm that this was an Under-13 match, and that Glen Eyre were bowled out for 13. They also have a photograph of the successful bowler, who they name as David Poole.

Cricket Archive has a player named David Poole (player no. 1416211) playing for New Forest District Colts XI in 1970, in a match in which he opened the bowling and took 4-12. If this was the same cricketer he would have been around 17 years old – the right sort of age for a 'Colts' player, and very much in the right part of the country. Whether these two cricketers were one and the same is not known, but it provides a possible further avenue of exploration.

Gross records that B Anderson (125*) and K Anderson (207*) shared an unbroken stand of 325 for the sixth wicket in the St Brendan's innings. He gives the venue simply as 'Mersey Valley', without identifying a country let alone anything more precise.

Detective work by Ric Finlay indicates that the match was probably at or near Devonport in the Mersey Valley in Tasmania, where St Brendan's (now St Brendan-Shaw College, so renamed in the 1970s or early 1980s) is a leading Catholic school. The nearby town of Burnie is home to Marist College, another leading Catholic school, so this could be the 'MCCC' referred to by Gross; but that might equally be Mersey [something] Cricket Club. (Information from Ric Finlay, with thanks).

The feat is noted in *Cricket Quarterly* vol. 5 no. 2 page 59, but with no more detail than given by Gross, except that it adds that the partnership lasted 100 minutes.

The cricket coverage of Launceston newspaper *The Examiner* has been checked for the early months of the 1966/67 season, but there is no mention of this match or feat. The paper does not routinely include details of local matches, which suggests that the feat is unlikely to be mentioned unless as a news item in its own right. Other Tasmanian newspapers have yet to be checked.

According to an item on page 38 of Jonathan Rice's *Curiosities of cricket*, Duncan Falconer played an innings of 206*, out of a total of 228, for Ewell in this match. If correct, this is 90.35% of the innings total, or a higher proportion off the bat if there were any Extras in the innings.

This Sunday fixture is not reported in any newspaper currently (June 2020) available in the BNA, nor in the contemporary editions of the *Dorking Advertiser*.

It is also not reported in *The Post in Epsom & Ewell* for 4 August 1988, though it does report Epsom CC's match of the previous weekend. The relevant edition of the *Epsom, Ewell & Banstead News* is missing from the microfilm at the BL, but to judge by the complete absence of cricket coverage in the following (11 August) edition of this freesheet, it is unlikely that Falconer's achievement would have been mentioned in that newspaper.

Both clubs reported to have participated in this match have been contacted (Ian Wyatt at Ewell, Andrew Halliday at Dorking), as has Jo Rice, but they have all been unable to confirm the feat, or any other details of the match.

This was a match in the Southern League Second XI Championship, which was won this season (for the third year in succession) by Bournemouth IIs.

The source says that Sammu (Sammy) Ashan scored his 352 off 123 deliveries, and then took 6-14. It is not certain from the report whether he was dismissed; it expressly says that Hirushan was not out, that they added 447 for the fourth wicket, and that the final innings total was 550-3; but it does not expressly say that Ashan too was not-out – which he must have been if all of these earlier details are correct. In fact, it twice gives his score as an unqualified 352 in the same breath as showing Hirushan's as 101 not-out, from which it may be inferred that Ashan had indeed been dismissed. This inference is strengthened by the fact that Ashan apparently only faced 123 deliveries in a 300-ball team innings, which seems a surprisingly low proportion.

If Ashan was not out when the innings closed, his team's third wicket must have fallen at 103. If that was not the case, the big partnership was most probably for the third wicket ; but either way a partnership of 447 for one wicket or another is confirmed in the above source, whether or not it remained unbroken when the innings ended.

Ashan went on to have a substantial senior career with SSC and also played five first-class matches for Sri Lanka A between 2018 and 2021/22.

[A correspondent writes] ‘Does the making of six catches by the same fielder, not a wicket-keeper, in one innings create a record?’ The question is answered by a letter written 22 years ago [1901] by the late Mr FG Harding, a veteran member of the old Islington Albion CC, who wrote: ‘This reminded me of an unique occurrence which took place in a match in which I played. One of the bowlers got all the ten wickets, which were caught by the same man, the bowler at the other end, at short slip.’ Unfortunately Mr Harding, who was a well-known figure in the cricket world years ago, and – it may be well to add – a truthful man, did not give the title and date of the game referred to. The score is not to be found in *Scores and Biographies*, or any of the sporting newspapers. It is very likely that it was a match played by the Islington Albion CC. Mr Harding was born in 1830 and died in 1914.’

This seems barely credible! No such instance has been traced in a trawl through the *Islington Gazette* in the BNA between 1860 and 1890.

A letter from 'CAWM' of Eastbourne, dated 29 May 1931 and printed on page 224 of *The Cricketer* 1931, says this:

'I would like to send you a statement I saw in some daily paper a few days ago, which said: "In a secondary school match one side were out for 2 runs, one of the opposing side's bowlers took ten wickets for no runs!" I take no responsibility for the truth of the statement, but just send it as a matter of interest.'

To date no scorecard matching such a performance has come to light. Note that the newspaper report referred to by 'CAWM' gives no indication of the date of the match to which it refers – it may have been earlier in the 1931 season, or it may have been much earlier.
